

#### Cecily, duchess of York, who lived

toward the end of the sixteenth century, was doomed to witness in her family more appalling calamities than probably are found in the history of any other individual. Twenty-six of her closest relatives, through whom land, were killed in battle, poisoned or murdered during her lifetime. Her father was that rash and powerful nobleman, Raiph Neville, earl of Westmoreland. She was the youngest of twenty-one children, and on becoming the wife of Richard Plantagenet, duke of York, her family exerted all their influence to place her on the thr ac of England. After a series of spleudid achievements, unparatteled in history, the whole family of Nevilles was swept away long before Cecily had descended in sorrow to her grave.
