Filed Your Income Tax Return?

TX7E feel it a duty to remind our patrons and friends that this is the last week for filing of income tax returns by firms and individuals.

Briefly, the law requires the filing of the report with the Internal Revenue Collector of this district on or before March 15th. The tax may be paid in four equal installments. The first one must accompany the report. Severe penalties are provided for failing to make return, for false returns and for failure to pay the tax.


