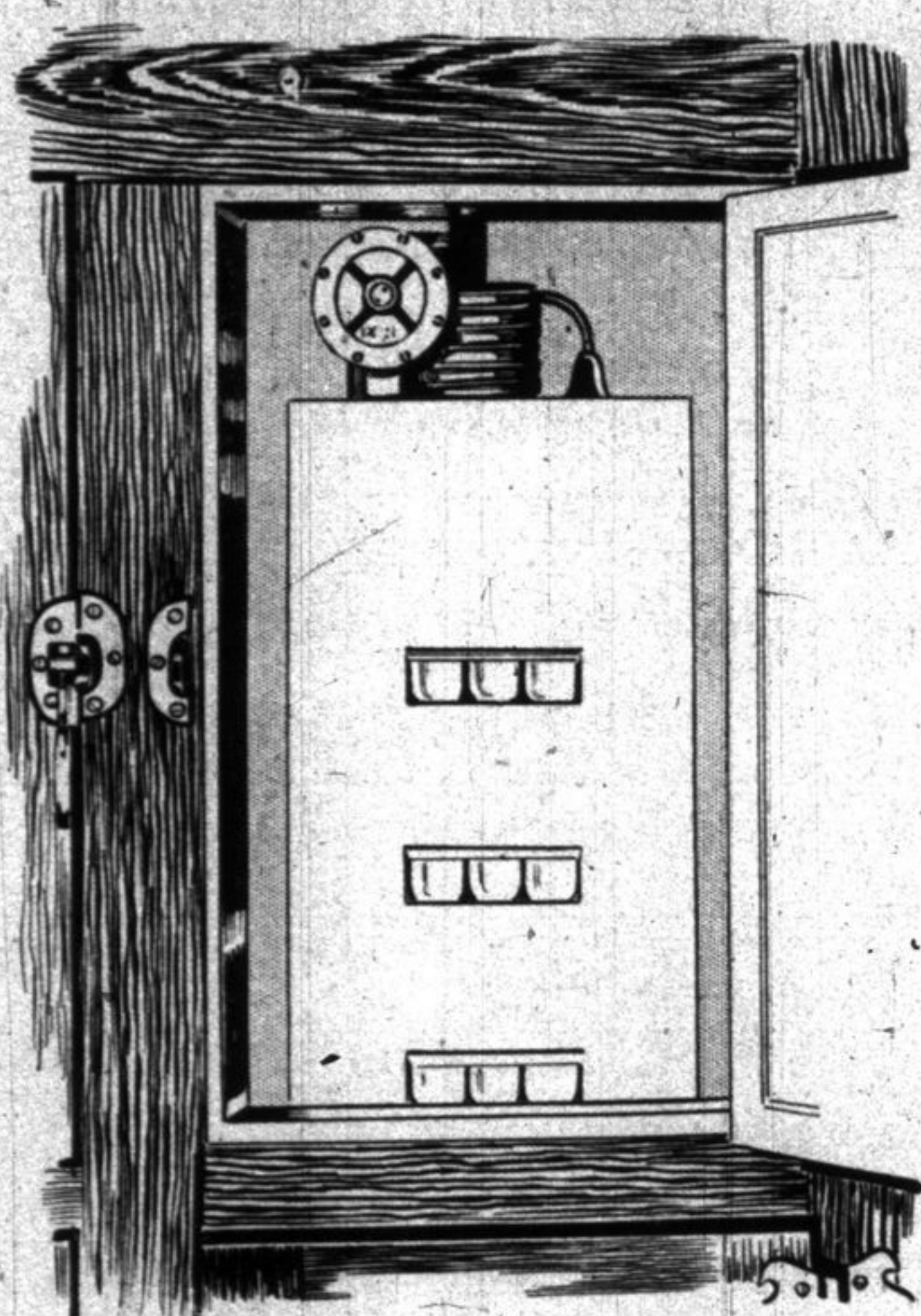

I like to do gardening for lovers of the out of doors, "and since I have done so for over 30 years," may I not do it for you? The cost is really insignificant compared to the pleasure one gets out of a good garden, be it a Bird Garden, a Rock-Garden, or just a finely selected planting along the boundary and house lines. Right here I like to call your attention to making the correct selection of material, as well as being bold in your color schemes.

Harmonious it must be, surely beautiful; finely combining all the complex problems of the master planter; blending of foliage and flower, matching of height and width, adaptability to soil, fragrance and ultimate effect. Planting after a "stencil" never makes a hit, the copying of foreign gardens is what it says, "to be admired only in original." I have travelled the globe and seen things; my conclusion is the "American Flower Garden."

Nature has blessed our United States with a fertile soil, it has blessed our North Shore twice, giving us Forests and Skokies, plus a very good clay loam that needs only cultivating to make things grow abundantly.

I believe in creating gardens out of the ORDINARY; Richard Wagner became famous when he composed "The Nibelungen Cycle and Parsifal." He went to extremes in creating discords, harmonious ultimately.

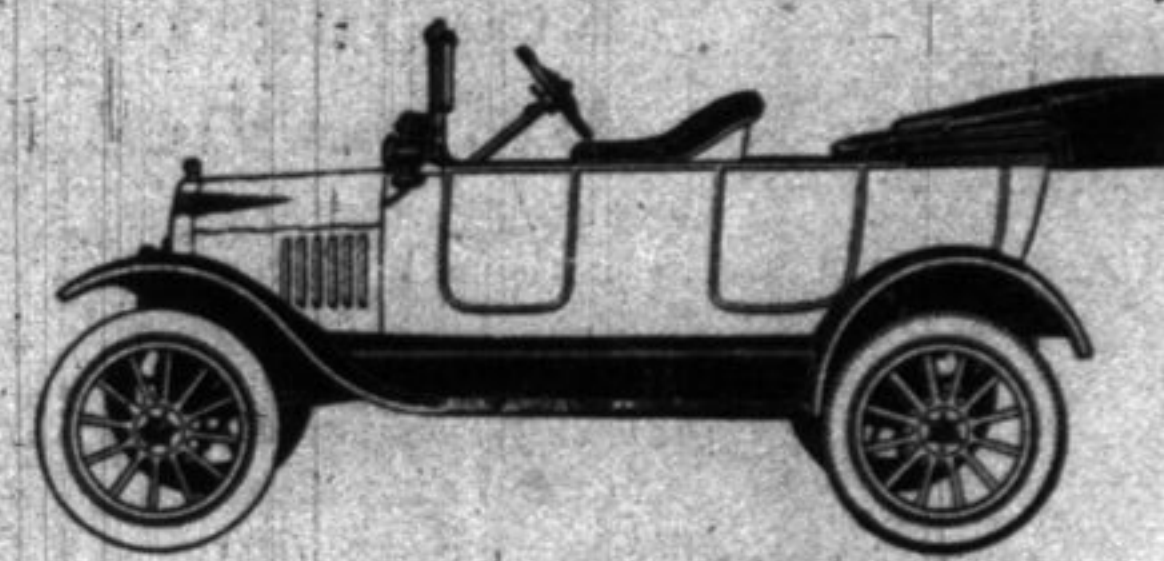
