The contractor will be paid in bonds, which bonds will draw interest at the rate of five (5) per cent per annum.

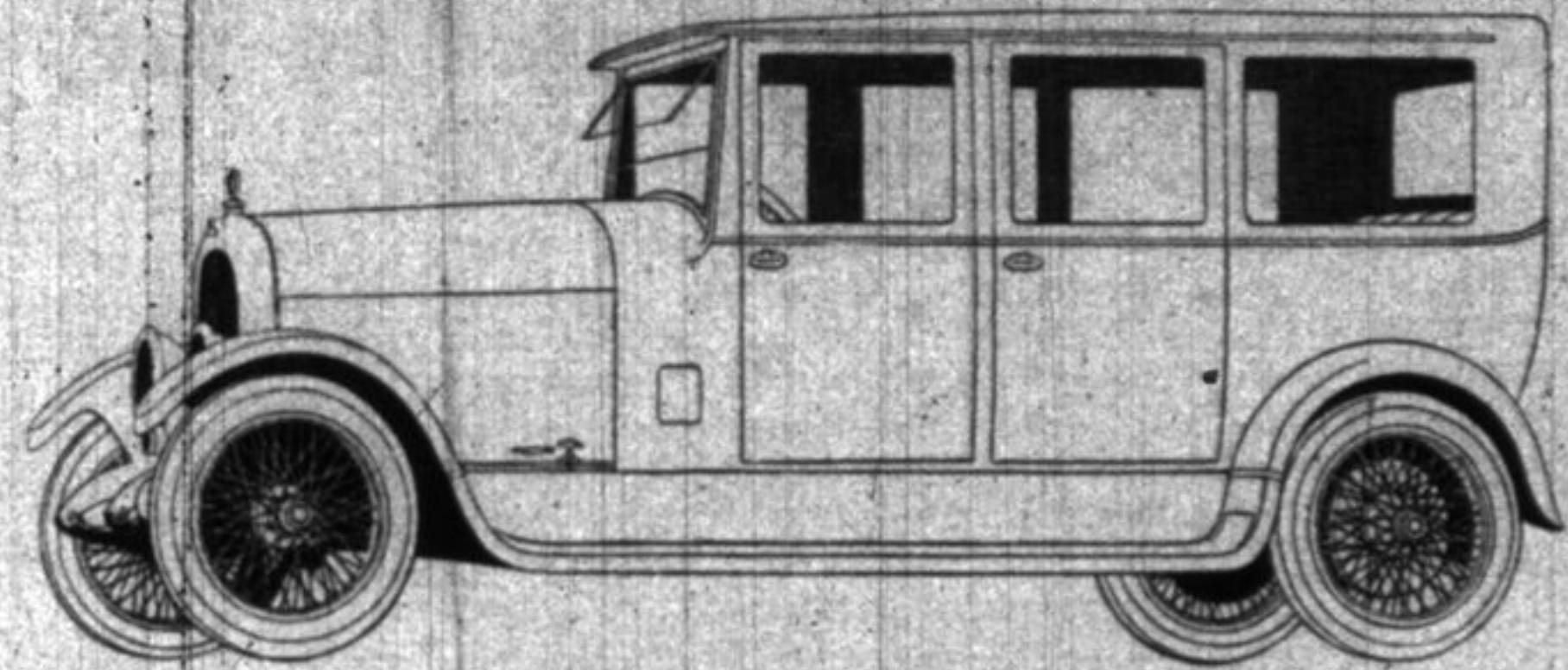
