 In spite of the snow storm there was a large attendance at the forenoon services last Sunday. The Easter lesson was studied by the Bible school, and then the children rendered an acceptable Easter program. Six names were added on confession of faith to the membership roll of the church.

This evening (Thursday) the Sunday school board will be entertained at the home of Mr. and Mrs. O. B. Brand.
 Regular church services will be held next Sunday forenoon and evening. This will be the last Sunday of the Conference year. At the evening service a statistical report of the year's work will be read by the pastor. The annual conference will meet next week at Naperville. This will be the 76th session, marking the completion of seventy-five years of history. Suitable recognition of the event will be given by the Conference in the dedication of a fund of \$17,000 which has been raised for the financial aid of Seminary students. Matters of interest to the public coming before Conference will be the election of two presiding elders; voting the recommendation of the late General Conference; action relative to church union, the Forward Movement, and the Interchurch World Movement; and the assignment of pastors for the entire Conference territory.
