Union services will be held next Sunday morning and evening, at both of which the Rev. J. H. Keagle will preach. The pastor of this church will be in attendance at the Annual Conference session at Naperville. Accordingly the members of this church will meet for worship at 10:15 a. m. with the congregation of the United Evangelical church; at 7:30 in the evening the two congregations will meet at Ebenezer church for the evening worship. The Sunday school will meet as usual on Sunday morning.

The statistical report read by the pastor at the Sunday evening service gave proof of substantial growth in the work of the congregation during the past conference year. The church gave an average of \$3.45 for missions, and an average of \$39.10 per member for all purposes during the year just ending.

INTERCHURCH WORLD MOVEMENT ENDORSED

Bishop Anderson, D. D., of Diocese of Chicago Approves Plans and Purposes of Work

The Rt. Rev. Chas. P. Anderson, D. D., Episcopal Bishop of Chicago, yesterday expressed his hearty sympathy with the plans and purposes of the Interchurch World Movement, the thirty denominations of which will inaugurate on April 25th an eight day campaign to raise \$366,777,572 for the world needs of those denominations. Because of the fact that the Episcopal church was in the midst of a Nation-wide campaign of its own when the Interchurch Movement was launched, this denomination has not become a part of the movement. Great satisfaction was expressed by leaders of the Interchurch, however, over the fact that the Episcopal church has taken occasion to express its full sympathy with the aims the Interchurch has in view.

"The success of one is the success of all," said Bishop Anderson. "Nothing will stimulate the Episcopal church more than to see that other denominations are being stimulated. I feel that the stimulating influences of the Interchurch World Movement will have a highly beneficial effect in the ranks of all christianizing and civilizing agencies. Because of this, I am very glad to give the Movement my full support and to wish it every success. I have no doubt that the Episcopal church would also have been enlisted in the Movement but for the fact that our own campaign was well under way when it was organized."

Bishop Anderson's endorsement of the Interchurch resulted from his attention having been called to the action of the governing council of the Episcopal church made public in New York by the Rt. Rev. Thomas J. Gallor, presiding bishop of the Protestant Episcopal church in the United States of America, expressing hearty sympathy with the purposes of the Interchurch Movement. The text of Bishop Gallor's statement follows:

"The presiding bishop and council have heard with interest of the progress of the Interchurch World Movement and hope that the Nation Wide campaign committee of this church and the authorities of the various dioceses will furnish to the survey contemplated by the Interchurch World Movement, such information concerning the work of this Church as may be desired. Inasmuch, however, as our own Nation-wide campaign is still in progress, the presiding bishop and council feel that they cannot take any official part or assume any financial responsibility in the Interchurch World Movement; while at the same time they assure the leaders of that Movement of their hearty sympathy with the purposes they have in view, and of their prayers that God will bless the Movement; to the extension of His Kingdom and the higher welfare of mankind."

The immediate result of this attitude of the Episcopal denomination it is believed will be to bring large numbers of the rank and file of that church into active support of the Interchurch conference of pastors there of this co-operative spirit was shown in the fact that large numbers of the Episcopal clergy in the diocese of New York recently attended the Interchurch conference of pastors there at the suggestion of Rt. Rev. Charles Sumner Burch, D. D., Bishop of the diocese.
