AMERICAN LEGION

The American Legion's campaign for membership started Monday, May 17, throughout the nation. Approximately 9,500 posts of the organization will work simultaneously and it is expected that one million new members will be gained in the campaign. This would give a total of two and one half million members to the American Legion.

In the majority of states governors have proclaimed this week as "American Legion Week." The active cooperation of the Red Cross, Y. M. C. A., Knights of Columbus, Community Service, Inc. and the Salvation Army has been obtained and persons prominent in all walks of life throughout the country have united in endorsing the Legion and its campaign.

As a matter of fact, the great American public has been eager to support the Legion in its activity and has cooperated with the same enthusiasm exhibited in various liberty bond campaigns, even though the public will not be called upon to contribute money.

A special effort will be made locally and throughout the nation to enroll ex-service men and women who have always intended to join the Legion but have put off doing so.

The Legion has made great steps in the few months of its existence in gaining the affection and respect of the average American. In cooperation with other agencies, it is working along a broad scheme of Americanization, designed to interest the foreign born. In numerous crises, such as riots and disasters, the members of the Legion have shown themselves first in working to alleviate conditions. That the organization is not a believer in direct action has been demonstrated by such instances as the massacre of its members at Centralia, Wash., when the very comrades of these men prevented the crowd from assailing the members of the I. W. W. who fired the murderous shots.

The organization is non-political, because its organization embraces men of every shade of political opinion. It has always refused to take sides in disputes between labor and capital, leaving each individual freedom of choice in the question. It is also non-military, membership not affecting a man's liability for military service in any way.
