The Misses Mary Tapper and Katherine Lytton of this city took prominent parts in the Kemper hall pageant which was held Tuesday.

Students of Kemper Hall, Kenosha, Wis., an Episcopal school under the supervision of the Sisters of St. Mary, wrote a pageant entitled "The Old World and the New," founded on historical incidents from Bible times to the present day, as the principal feature of the school's fiftieth anniversary and commencement.

A colorful lantern parade thru the grounds followed the pageant.

Commencement exercises opened with Baccalaureate Sunday on June 6th, and closed yesterday (Wednesday), June 9, with an "Old Girls' Banquet.




