TIME CHANGED WITH LITTLE CONFUSION

NEW RAILROAD SCHEDULE

North Shore Moves its Clocks Ahead One Hour; Railroad Still Using the "Sun" Time

Last Sunday morning the north shore awoke an hour earlier and proceeded about its various activities as usual. The change in the time schedule was effected without much trou-

Some confusion was experienced Sunday and Monday due to misunderstanding about train schedules; but later the changes were better understood, and after few slight misunderstandings matters ran smoothly

Through trains are being operated as before; while suburban trains are run just an hour earlier. The Chicago & Northwestern railroad is using sun time in operating its trains, and has merely changed its timetables to read an hour earlier. For instance, the train that formerly left Chicago at 5:10 in the evening, since the change in time, leaves at 4:10. The timetables read "Central Standard Time, which is one hour slower than Daylight Saving Time." Railroad schedules and railroad clocks are set just one hour behind other clocks in the Chicago district.

The whole affair appears very confusing at first, but with a little practice will no doubt work out very well. Everyone is through work an hour earlier, and has an added hour or daylight in the evening for recreation.

The plan has worked out successfully in New York and other eastern cities. Detroit, too, has adopted the plan, and the smaller cities in the Chicago district, including Elgin, Gary, and suburban towns have made the change. Some of the smaller suburban communities, who delayed setting their time ahead, experienced some difficulty, until they conformed to Chicago time. Aurora, East Chicago, and several other cities rejected the plan.


