

Added to this is the increased price of all material used in the business. To meet these expenses the utility needs an adjustment of rates.

This is the reason and the only reason. If it were not for these heavy increases in wages and material the telephone company would be in a position to render efficient service without any adjustment of rates.

APPELATE COURT DENIES RE-HEARING
