## WAUKEGAN CRAFT HAS NARROW ESCAPE, SUNDAY

### LOCAL CREW CALLED OUT

Heavy Gale Prevented Rescue of Party of Eight. Rescued in Chicago on Monday

The Young Men's club life saving crew was called out at 9:15 last Sunday night to go to the rescue of a yacht "Moaki," owned by Capt. Blakemore of Waukegan. Owing to the high seas and being unable to locate the distressed boat, the crew did not venture out, but patrolled the beach for several hours waiting to receive a distress signal. The boat put into the Chicago harbor Monday morning, a total wreck after an all night run with the storm and a battle against disaster.

The 35 foot boat left Waukegan Sunday morning for a short cruise. The party consisted of eight residents of Waukegan, among them being Capt. G. L. Blakemore and his wife, Miss Margaret Anderson, Misses Vera and Eva Harter and their brother, Thomas, Miss Gladys Wells and William Thomas. They were off the fort pier at 4:30 p. m. when the wind came up and the lake roughened. Capt. Blakemore decided to take no chances on a storm but to put into a harbor at Great Lakes. He started on the task that would have taken him to safety when the stiff breeze suddenly shifted.

The life boat was shattered with the first stroke of the gale, and the main sail was whipped into ribbons. The captain dropped anchor, but the hook failed to hold. A second later the anchor chain parted and the yacht swung into the trough of the sea.

At Evanston they attempted to signal the life saving station, but passed by unseen.

Capt. Blakemore is employed by the Western Photographic Studios of Waukegan. He served in the navy during the war. His previous training in the navy helped in keeping the boat from swamping.
