4,000 SEE PERFORMANCE

Youngsters Make Good Showing in Monster Event at Ravinia; Program for the Week

Four thousand people, the large crowd Ravinia Park has ever drawn a children's afternoon program years, gathered last Thursday afternoon to see the children's pageant and flower carnival.
