

SEED AND FOOD COSTS

One reason why food production is unsatisfactory, and food costs the consumer high, is that so much of the seed planted by the farmer is poor. The Iowa Experiment station in one year has examined 3300 samples of seed corn for farmers. It found 19 per cent of these seeds dead, and 21 per cent was too weak to be of any

It would seem as if every farmer would want to have his seed tested before going to the expense of plant-• ing it. Probably the experiment stations of the country would have facilities so that all the farmers could do it. If so, it would abundantly pay to have sufficient facilities added so that adequate tests could be made of all seed supplies.

A great deal of poor seed is worked off. The farmer gets higher prices when as a consequence food production falls off, so that the mass of the people are the worst sufferers.

In the senate the important committee of Live Stock and Dairying is presided over by a druggist. There are ten Chicago Senators on the committee, eight lawyers and two farmers,one' the beef cattle breeder and the other the dairy farmer.
