HIGHEST SPOT IN COUNTY

Would be Desirable Location Beautiful Estate. Only 1 1/4 Miles From Highland Park

Highland Park is destined to be city of beautiful homes; this includes the entire North Shore. If we look forward to the next 25 years we would probably see the entire North Shore containing more splendid residential palaces, and country homes and estates than any other portion of the United States.

There are several reasons bring this about. Its geographical position, its topographical beauty, its location on the shore of Lake Michigan with a half-hour ride from Chicago and its 3,206,000 inhabitants, and no other place for wealthy Chicagoans go for desirable homes - even if they are all dressed up.

Chicago's great south side is put out of the running as far as residences are concerned, on account of its manufacturing areas; again the dark cloud caused by colored population. Cook county voted \$11,000,000 for the purchase of Forest Preserves, taking the timber land - the principal beauty of country here - out of the market.

All these will have their effect inducing wealthy Chicagoans to select the North Shore for their homes. And when we see some of these places with 1200 to 200 acres each, may well wonder where they are going to get the land.

Wooded or timbered land is doubtfully going to be scarce, forested areas outside of Lake Park and New York have become scarce and high priced that they almost are unobtainable. Wealthy Chicagoans are beginning to realize this.

We have some wooded property around Highland Park that we make an ideal country home, or estate, as there would be no income to pay, although the property is double and triple in value. One in particular, one and one-quarter miles west of Highland Park, probably the densest forest east of the Rocky mountains, and claimed to be the highest point in Lake County. (Continued on Page 7)

ENROLLMENT LARGE IN LOCAL SCHOOLS

Elm Place Registers 585 Pupils Day; Lincoln School 165 High School 450

The attendance at the local schools on the opening days has been unusually large. At Elm Place 585 children were enrolled the first day 75 more have been registered to turn the early part of next week. Beginning classes are unusually large and it may be that the rules relating to the admission of children to school age may have to be put in effect to relieve crowding.

About 350 pupils were enrolled at the Deerfield-Shields high school, being about the same number were enrolled last year. It is expected that there will be a larger number that will enter during the opening week as a great many have returned from their vacations. A number of pupils have returned to Deerfield this year to take up optional courses or special work.

The Lincoln school opened on day, registering 165 pupils in school. This is the largest enrollment in the history of the school. The intermediate grades are unusually crowded and the need for an additional teacher is very great. Miss Rook who was to have had charge of the third and fourth grades, did not arrive. Mrs. Wright is substituting for this week in the third and fourth grades and it is planned to have Margaret Decker Harvey, a former teacher of this district, assigned permanently.

Ninety children were admitted to the Ravinia school this year, being the largest number ever enrolled. The West Ridge school enrollment this year being approximately the same as last year.
