Elect the right men to office. Stop gambling and complaining. Don't lay yourself open to the accusation of "slacker" now when it's up to every man and woman to put the right people into office. No matter how much you know about politics and national issues, there is more that you can learn, some other person's point of view which it will benefit you to know. Books and magazines and pamphlets are at the Public Library for you. The attendant at the loan desk is there for the purpose of helping everyone to get whatever they desire. John Spargo, the famous American Socialist, has just published a new book, "The Greatest Failure in All History." If you believe in the ideal of the commune you will want to read this book. If you fight socialistic ideals, you will want to read this book. Like all his books, this is well written, and authoritative. Bolshevism has many possibilities, and with its great ideal, great faults and weakness. It has had a thorough trial in Russia. Some people think it has succeeded in living up to the ideal, but it is significant that so thorough a socialist as Spargo should write: "Bolshevism is autocratic and despotic in its essence. . . . It is well to remember that whatever there is of freedom and good will in Russia, of democratic growth, exists in fundamental defiance and antagonism to Bolshevism and would be crushed if the triumph of the latter became complete." "Whoever believes—as the present writer does—that the only rational and coherent hope for the progress of civilization lies in the progress of democracy, must reject Bolshevism and all its works and present leaders of this terrific revolution in Russia, bided their time, promulgating their doctrines and spreading their ideals in our United States, the problem of Bolshevism is more startling and close to us than we realize. To combat any disease (either physical or political) one must know the history of the disease. Here is Bolshevism. Let's operate.

"The Great Modern American Stories" is an excellent collection of short stories compiled and edited by William Dean Howells. He is often called "the Dean of American Letters," and his judgment of literature should be considered. But looking over the list of the stories I cannot help wondering why he included Edith Wyatt and Charlotte Perkins Stetson Gilman and omitted O. Henry. Perhaps O. Henry is too colloquial for the "Dean's" literary taste. But here is Brete Hart! The compiler does not claim this to be ALL of the great modern American stories and perhaps the advantage of having pointed out to us some whom we have considered not so great, has advantages. Dreiser and Ambrose Bierce, Edward Everett Hale and Mark Twain are represented by stories, as one would expect. It is exceedingly interesting to read the stories on which so great a man has set the seal of his uninfluenced approval.

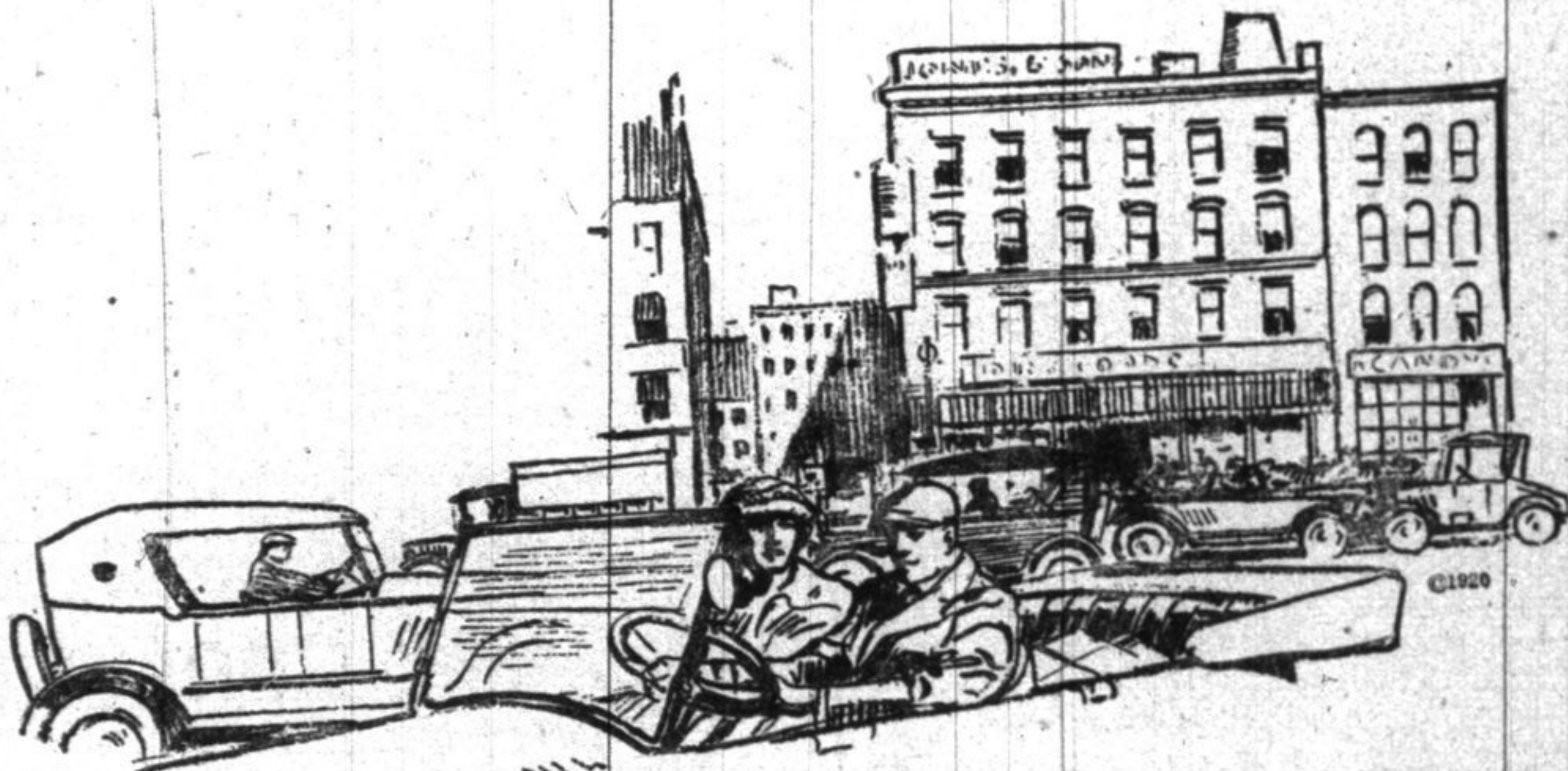
