This he did, with the further promise that the Waukegan gang would allow no candidate for representative from Lake County and his nomination would be certain.

Why hold elections costing millions, when the politicians will pick the candidates for nothing? Then the horrible gall of it all was when this gang sent word to Senator Swift that it would beat him if he tried to be renominated.

But Swift had a record for service


