## ANOTHER BIG SEASON AT RAVINIA PARK

NEARLY 5,000 ATTEND

"L'Oracolo" and "La Navarraise"  
Final Program on Monday.  
Scotti Appeared as  
Chim Fang

Nearly five thousand people attended the closing performance of the Ravinia Opera season which came to a close Monday evening following a highly successful season. The ten weeks passed have been unusually interesting, and Ravinia under the general management of Louis Eckstein, has taken rank with the two leading operatic organizations of America.

In summing up the program of the opera season one must mention the three last performances which are always a grand finale to the season.

On Saturday evening Don Pasquale was repeated. Sunday a repetition of "Zaza" was presented. Little Ada Quintina of New York, a twelve year old girl, who appears with the Metropolitan Opera company, was unusually charming in the part of Tota in "Zaza."

Saturday evening Leon's one act opera, "L'Oracolo," and Massenet's one act "La Navarraise" were put forth, Antonio Scotti repeating his well known Chim-Fang, with a cast containing Florence Easton, Leon Rothier, Sinagra, Kent and D'Angelo in the other roles, and Gennaro Papi conducting.

Scotti's sinister portrayal grows more realistic each time he repeats the role of the Chinese hatchet man, and the lucious singing of Easton, the craftiness of Rothier's Win-Shee and the clever choral work, give point and interest to the opera.

La Navarraise has in Alice Gentle a model impersonator. It is a tragic role which Miss Gentle sings and acts with unrestrained passion and while the opera does not classify among Massenet's masterpieces it offers to her, as well as to Morgan Kingston and Leon Rothier, ample opportunities for lyric and dramatic display. Richard Hageman conducted.

### Praise for Stars

Edith Mason, the American prima-donna, made herself an ineffaceable memory by her incomparable Butterfly, and the wistful charm of her Micaela. It is only hoped that she may remain on this side of the water as our permanent possession.

Florence Easton added to her glory by exhibiting wonderful improvement in the handling of tone-coloring and dramatic expression. Her Tosca, Nedda, and Butterfly were all fine performances.

Charles Hackett, who, in the beginning of his engagement, fell beneath his standard in the French Repertoire, retrieved himself nobly by his Al-maviva in the Barber and his very good Rodolphe of La Boheme.

Alice Gentle is remarkably versatile. Rarely does one find the histrionic temperament that can play Anaide in Zaza one evening, and the next La Navarraise. Miss Gentle is passionately absorbed in her art, and this sincerity is reflected in everything she interprets.

Kingston gave of his clarion-like organ at its best in Aida, Butterfly and Zaza. His is easily one of the finest tenor voices on the lyric stage.

Zanelli is a young new-comer with a robust, warm baritone. His evident talents were at their finest in Pagliacci.

Leon Rothier is always the sober, dignified French artist, reflecting all the fine traditions of his school.

Picco's best work was in the Barber.

Among the minor artists it is only just to mention the excellent work of Mary Kent in Frederick in Mignon and the superb Goro of Paltrinieri in Butterfly, as well as Ananian's Bustamente and other roles of lesser importance which he knows so well how to project across the footlights.

Agnini's stage-management was no negligible factor in the success of the Summer.

Leaders are Masters  
The two chefs d'orchestra were the backbone of the season. Papi conducted everything by heart, and like a master.

Hageman was not only on constant duty conducting the orchestra concerts and his repertoire of French and Italian operas, but found time to compose.

The season closed as the most successful in the history of Ravinia, giving Mr. Eckstein, the president, ample grounds for congratulations.
