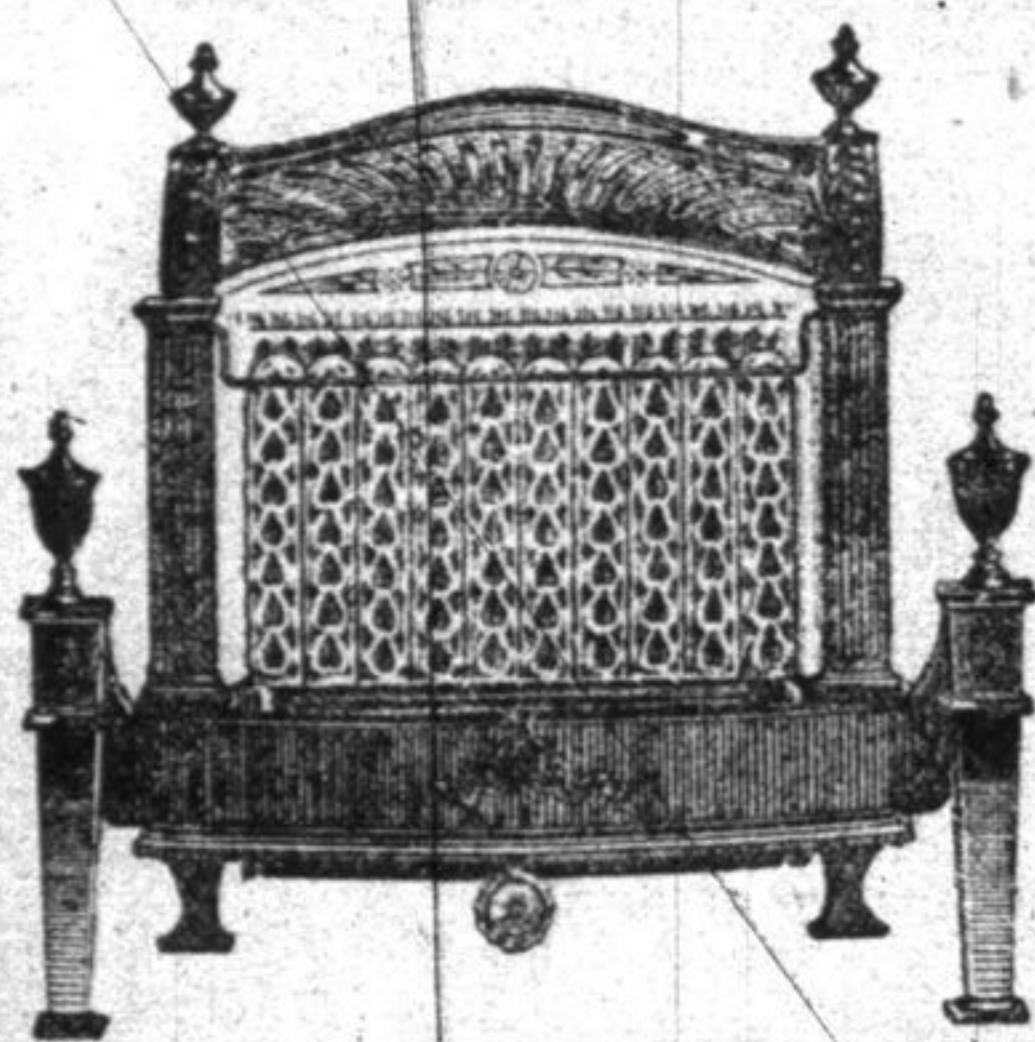

A very large crowd of baseball fans from Highland Park turned out Sunday to witness the two games by the local teams. At one thirty o'clock the Community Center team met and defeated the Highwood team by a score of 12 to 1. The batteries were Rudolph and Gerkin. At three thirty the H. P. Regulars played Des Plaines defeating them by a score of 8 to 0. Wintleborn's pitching was a feature of this game, he having 18 strikeouts to his credit and allowing only two hits.

Highland Park was well represented at Des Plaines Monday, but just before the game a heavy rain flooded the field and spoiled what looked like a hot battle. Des Plaines has decided to forfeit the series, claiming the regulars were a little too strong for them.

A series with Waukegan's best team is practically arranged and will start about the latter part of this month. On next Sunday the Chicago Passenger club will play the locals and a great contest is anticipated as they have won the championship of the Railway Industrial League playing in Detroit, Cleveland, Toledo, Philadelphia, New York and numerous other large cities throughout the United States.

The new management of the local club has strengthened the team so that it can hold its own against the best teams around Chicago. On Monday, Labor day, the Community Center team again met the Highwood team, playing at Highwood, taking the game with a score of 2 to 1.
