## FACTORY BUILDS HOMES FOR ITS EMPLOYEES

THIRTY HOUSES ARE DONE

Tannery at Waukegan to Sell  
These Homes at Cost, on  
the Installment  
Plan

What is probably one of the most extensive and most successful movements involving the housing problem in this part of the country is nearing termination in the northwest part of Waukegan where the Greiss-Pfleger Tannery company subdivision is about to be thrown open for residence purposes for employees of the big factory.

If you can imagine thirty houses each of a distinct appearance and each as modern as most up-to-date building can produce and if you can imagine them placed on lots 41x135 ft. in one of the prettiest spots of that community then you will have an idea of the transformation that has been brought about as a result of the efforts and expenditure by the Tannery company, which originated this housing plan in the hope of providing residences for its employees who have been having difficulty finding places in which to live.

A visit to the new subdivision which was purchased by the Tannery company a year ago and which included 168 lots reveals the fact that a wonderful transformation has taken place in the north part of the city.

There are ten bungalows and twenty houses all under roof and by Monday of next week twenty of the number will have been finished and ready for occupancy.

Each bungalow has five rooms and the houses, two stories, have six rooms besides which there is a bath in each house. They are modern in every respect including electric lights, laundry tubs, furnaces, electric fixtures, shades, screens, with cement walks about the houses, sewer and water and in fact every convenience that a house requires.

Every place is furnished with hard wood floors.

A distinctive feature in every house is that there is a clothes closet off every bedroom, the basements are cemented and are exceptionally light for rooms below the surface.

These homes are sold without profit to the company.
