WHEN TRAVELERS MEET



Many are the big caravans made up in Smyrna, where they receive their cargoes from the ships of the Mediterranean and start inland over miles of desert and mountain trail, to bring back in return rich rugs and tapestries for Europe and America.

The American Bluejacket is familiar with the Cameleer and his camels, and many words of banter are passed between the two as they pass in the streets of the cities in the near East, the Bluejacket with his jaunty swagger and the travel stained Cameleer with the carriage of the free desert people and a smile upon his lips.

Both are great travelers. When the dusky son of the caravan returns to his inland cities, he will sip his coffee while he tells the townspeople all the news of the coast. For the Cameleer is the only authentic source of news in the desert.

He tells his people of the great ships which were in the port of Smyrna, during his last trip to that city, giant ships from the land of plenty, where all men are free, and that night the wise ones count their shekels and dream of a great journey.

In another town far inland in America, a Bluejacket holds his listeners spellbound, while he tells them of the sights in the near East, and his listeners have a warmer feeling for the traveler from the desert who is trying to make his way in America and become a useful citizen in the land of the free. So while the Cameleer holds his audience spellbound in Turkey, his American Sailor friend holds his likewise in America, and both reap the reward of added knowledge which comes through meeting the other.

COLLECTIVE BARGAINING

The term "collective bargaining" means that wage-workers shall have the right to organize, and through their chosen representatives, make bargains with their employers concerning wages and other phases of their work. During the war this method of governing employment gained full official recognition, and former President Taft was chairman of the War Labor board that put teeth into the enforcement of the principle in industry.

Railroad employers and wage-workers reached the progressive viewpoint that the Government should be taken into consideration as the logical protector of the public interest, and more than two million railroad men agreed with their employers to an adjustment of wage relations by the federal government. Other industries have been asking the Government to adjudicate their affairs, and through the plan of "collective bargaining" the process has been making rapid progress.

The coal miners have been persistent in their demands upon Washington, and the Government has been rendering the fullest assistance in settling the troubles that have arisen. However, it appears to be up to the coal miners to rid their organizations of anarchists, bolshevists and I. W. W.'s since that element is prominent in leadership among them. And public opinion has passed the point where it will sustain such leaders.

The railroads were built by the digging of flannel shirted laborers, and they are supported by the still deeper digging in their pockets of the silk shirted travelers.
