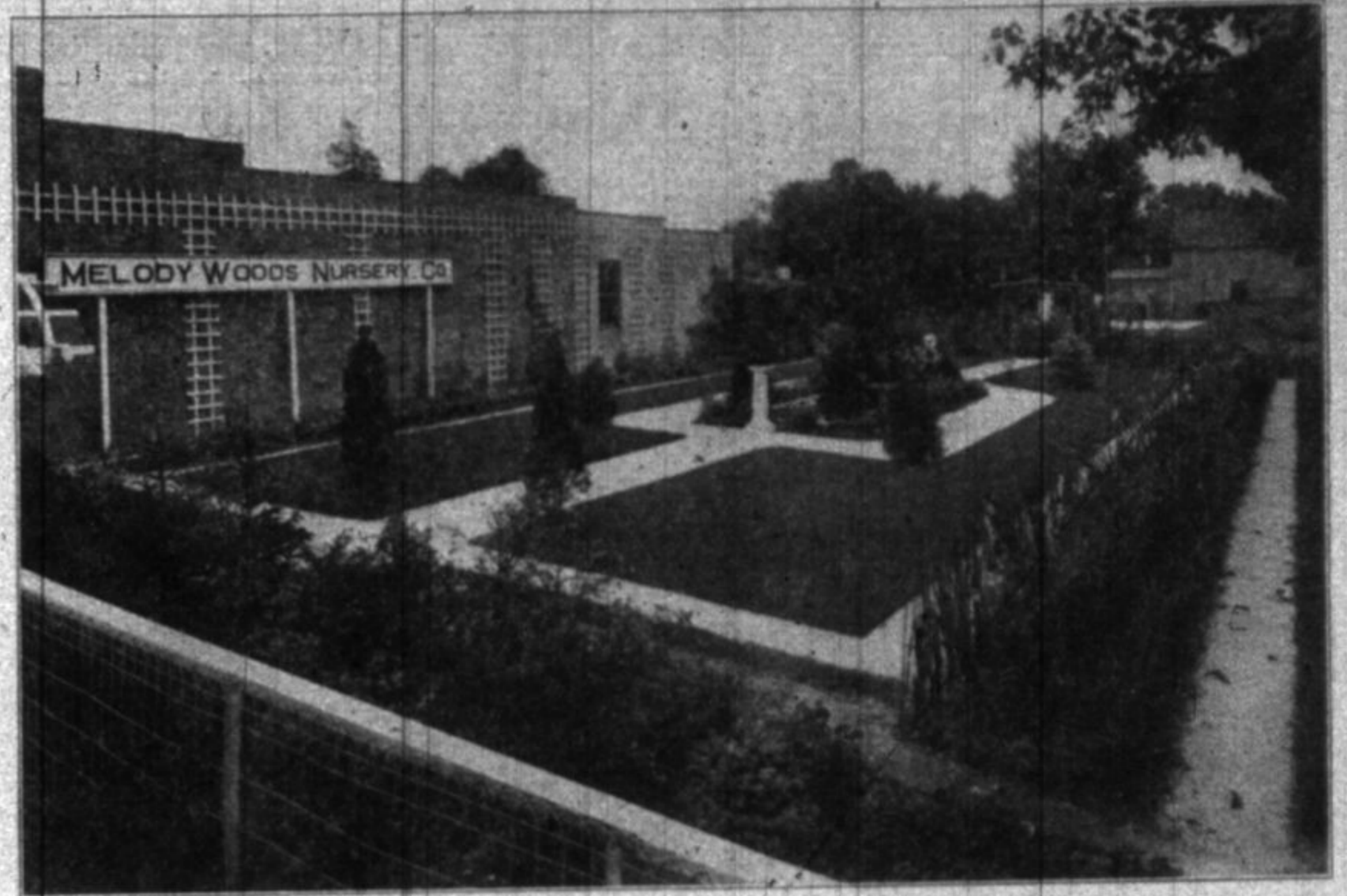

GAS RATES IN IOWA ARE MUCH HIGHER

Individual Control by City Councils Proves a Boost for Gas Charges

Gas rates in Illinois are 30 to 60 per cent cheaper than in Iowa, which state has no public utilities commission having jurisdiction over prices and services as in this state.

In Iowa the price paid by householders is still a matter of dickering between the utilities and the many city councils, the state being one of the remaining five of the union which has not adopted regulation of all utilities by a single state body having continuing jurisdiction and able to adjust rates as conditions require.

A comparison of official figures of existing gas rates in Iowa under so-called "home rule" regulation and in Illinois under "state commission regulation," the cities in the two states compared being of similar size, clearly indicates the benefits that have accrued to Illinois gas users in the shape of prices, regardless of the tremendously increased operating expenses of the companies.

The comparison is based on prices for gas as of Sept. 1, being the net rate per thousand cubic feet, and is as follows:

ATTACK VOLIVA WITH BULL DURHAM SIGN

Independents Erect Sign in Which the Overseer Is Made the Goat

Voliva is still on the war path with his bulletin boards. The Independents, or anti-Voliva faction, erected a bulletin board on the corner of 27th street and Sheridan road, and they attacked the Zion overseer in the strongest terms.

VOTE TO CONSOLIDATE FIVE COUNTRY SCHOOLS

An election for the purpose of voting for or against the proposition of creating a community consolidated in the neighborhood of Wauconda, and including 25 sections of land in the territory, will be held October 2.

The districts affected are No. 86, Wauconda school, No. 87, Davlin school, No. 81, Murray school, No. 85, Glych school, No. 20J, Slocum Lake school.

T. Arthur Simpson, county superintendent of schools, stated that the plan is to construct a consolidated school and equip it with the latest educational equipment, as much more can be accomplished in this manner than by conducting the five districts independently.

The present enrollment in the five districts is 140. All the buildings are old and would have to be replaced before many years. It is believed that the one consolidated school could be maintained more economically than five different ones. The individual schools require seven teachers, while the consolidated school would require only four.
