As a preliminary step toward the realization of the plan, the club has compiled a complete list of the military leaders who made the supreme sacrifice . The official casualty report of the American Expeditionary Force formed the nucleus of this list, but hundreds of names have been

Through correspondence with governors and adjutant generals in each state, clubs, lodges, business concerns and next-of-kin, Admiral Fiske has been able to compile what is believed to be the most authentic list of officers dead on record.

As it is the aim of the organization to commemorate the officers individually, the club has secured the civil and military records of each with other interesting data, including copies of citations, general orders, photographs and memorial books, which will be preserved for all time in the archives of the new clubhouse.
