### WOOD BUILDINGS AT FORT TO BE RAZED

NO NEW CONSTRUCTION NOW

Post Grounds to be Cleared and Brought Back to Old Time Beauty

"Yes, the wooden structures now a part of Fort Sheridan hospital will be torn down," said Captain L. A. Merillat, chief of the Utilities Department, in reply to a question recently. "But the date for commencing the work has not been announced, as yet."

While definite information is not as yet available as to the time when the work of wrecking the wooden structures will be started, it is reasonable to assume, according to one authority, that it will be started soon after the hospital is closed.

Whenever a start is made the work will be rushed with a view to having everything in readiness for a systematic beautifying of the post grounds next Spring. At one time in its history Fort Sheridan was rated one of the finest scenic spots in this part of the country and among the most beautiful of the many attractive regular army military posts. It is estimated that several years will be required to bring back all of the old time beauty to the lawns, flower beds and the parade ground.

#### No New Buildings

Captain Merillat stated that at present no new construction work is contemplated, with the exception of completing the installation of curbing and general resurfacing of roads within the boundaries of the post.

Recently bids were asked for from outside contractors for the erection of a new pier to take the place of the time-worn, ram-shackle structure which at present juts into the lake from the Fort Sheridan beach, but the cost of the work was considered prohibitive at this time and no steps will be taken in the matter of erecting a new pier until such time as building costs decline materially.

Buildings 50, 106, 107 and 108 are now being remodelled for use as headquarters of the Sixth Corps, which will be transferred to Fort Sheridan on or about October 15.

Buildings 1, 2, 121, 122, and 123 are now being renovated and given a thorough going over in preparation for the transfer of the patients who will be taken over by the Station Hospital when the general hospital closes.

Seven Destroyers Now Ready for Duty in European Waters

Information has this date been received from the Bureau of Navigation, Navy Department, Washington, D. C., to the effect that the six following destroyers: STURTEVANT, REUBEN, JONES, WILLIAMSON, SANDS, CHILDS, and McFARLAND are being fitted out for duty in European waters at the Navy Yard, Philadelphia, Pa. ### FORT SHERIDAN RECALL CEASES PUBLICATION

The Fort Sheridan Recall is no more. With the twenty-third number of its second volume it makes its a seventy-six week's "hitch" in the Army.

The decrease in the number of farewells to the public, after serving patients and the orders to reduce Lovell General hospital to a 200-bed post hospital sounded the death-knell of that publication. A conference in Washington, D. C., of the members of the Surgeon General's staff resulted in orders to suspend publication with last Friday's issue, and pack the plant for shipment, probably to Carlisle where it will be installed and run by soldier-printers trained on the Recall, as part of the Army Medical Service School.

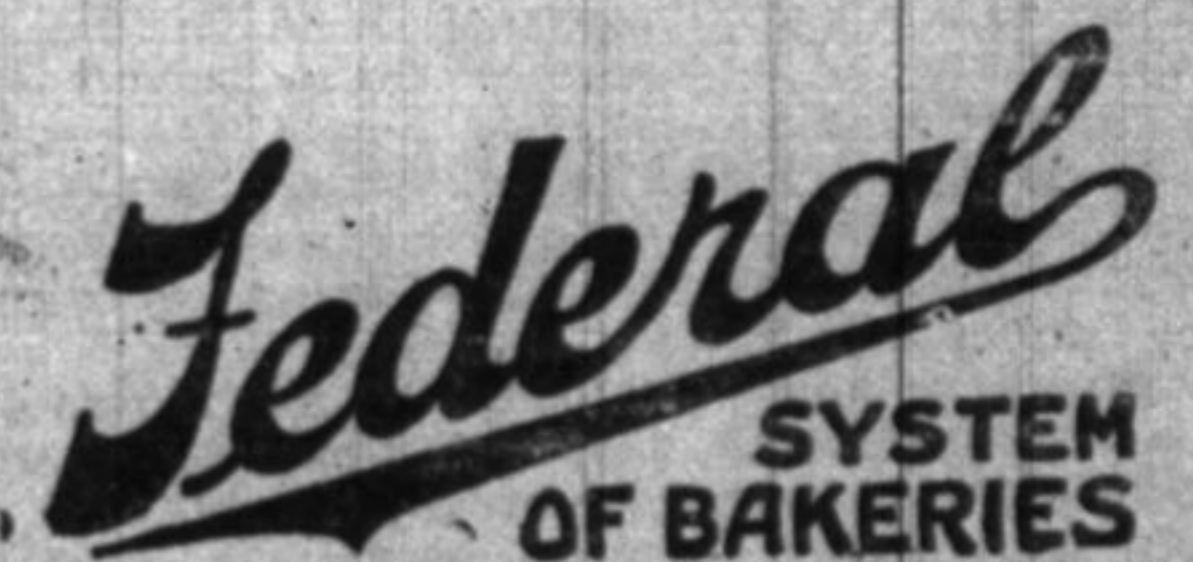
