SHORT-SELLING WHEAT SHOULD BE STOPPED

"The machinery of the wheat trade has absolutely failed to function properly under the strain imposed by collective foreign export buying. It was a mistake to give up government control, so far as export sales are concerned, until foreign buyers return to individual instead of collective export buying. And it was equally a mistake under such conditions to permit the resumption of unrestricted future trading because it furnished the foreign monopoly buyer with additional power to depress prices during his period of export purchasing," declares the Orange Judd Farmer of Chicago, in discussing the raid on the price of wheat.

"When we ended our governmental control we gave up collective selling and put it up to every individual wheat grower to sell his own wheat in unlimited competition with every other wheat grower. As there was left for our surplus wheat practically only one buyer and thousands of sellers, it meant monopoly buying and competitive selling. When speculative future trading was again opened in July it served to give this monopoly buyer an additional weapon against prices, and there is every reason to believe that in order to influence sentiment and frighten wheat growers into letting go of their wheat these foreign buyers have deliberately manipulated future quotations through concentrated and unrestricted short selling at the moment when public distrust of all prices was evident.

"Congress should promptly create a wheat export monopoly under governmental control to continue so long as the present foreign buying monopoly exists. And it should require the grain trade to harmonize with such export control by restricting or entirely forbidding, if necessary, the practice of short selling in the wheat market."
