NOVEMBER MILK PRICE IS \$3.05

The Milk Producers' Co-operative Marketing Company, which supplies the bulk of the milk shipped into Chicago from Illinois, Wisconsin and Indiana, has cut its price per hundred pounds from \$3.70 to \$3.05, which represents a reduction to the wholesalers of approximately 1-3 cents a quart. The \$3.05 figure will be the November price at which distributors of milk at retail will buy their product. As there has been no advance in the cost of labor or handling, it is believed at least 1 cent will be taken off the retail price in Chicago.

An added reason for the reduction is that there has been a slump in the condensed milk or canned milk market.
