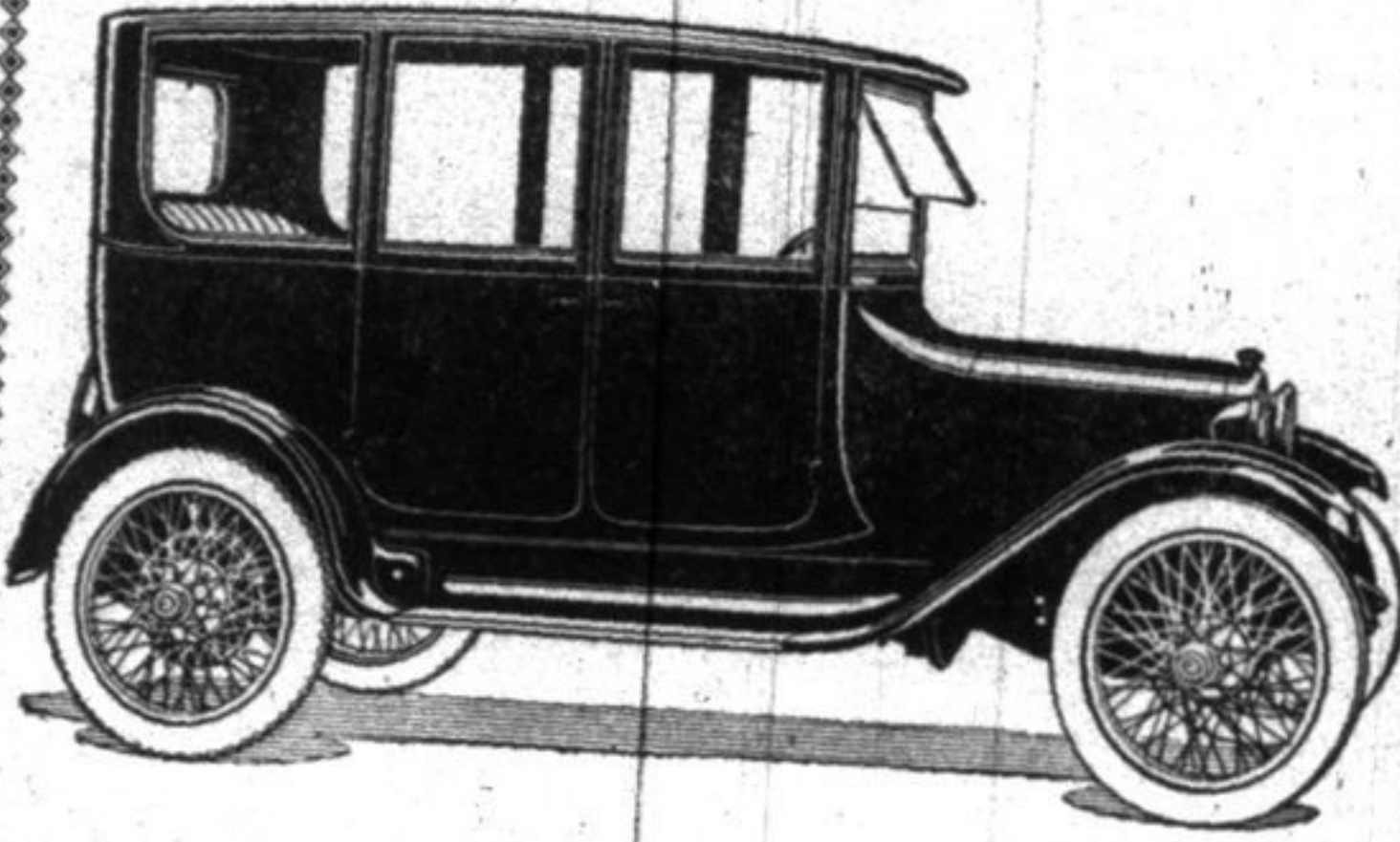


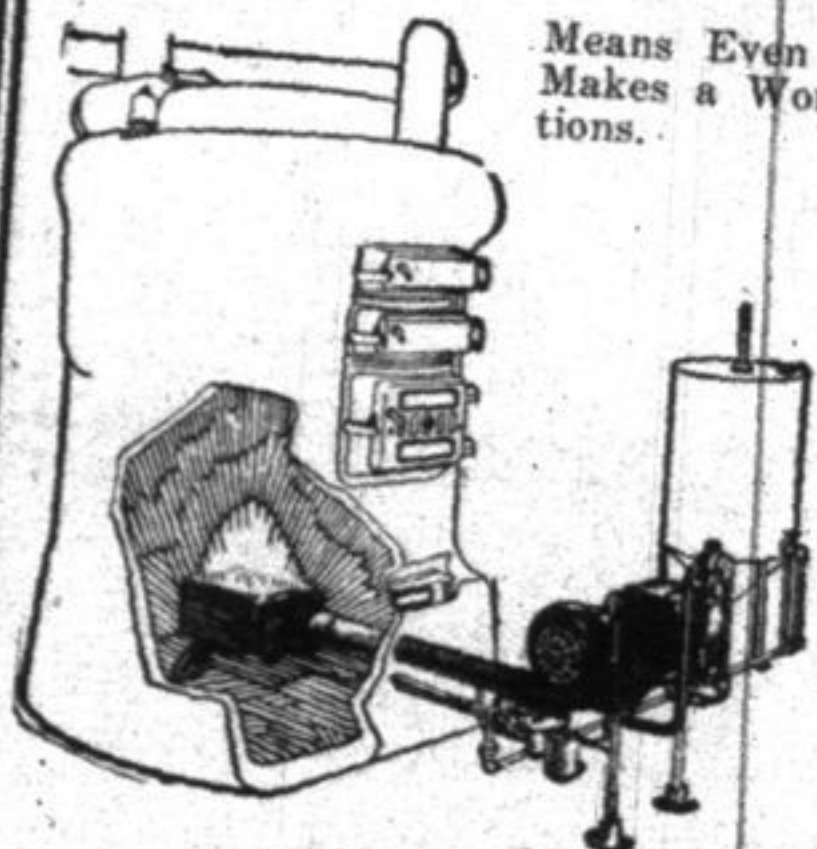

CONTRIBUTES \$12,812.00 TO NEAR EAST RELIEF

Lake County Committee to Enlarge That Amount This Year

Lake County contributed last year more than \$12,812.00 to Near East Relief, but S. W. Slaughter, chairman, expects to secure more than that amount this year. A committee including Prof. T. A. Simpson, Rev. Geo. Roberts, James Woodman, Charles Steele, Mrs. B. A. Munson, Mrs. William Albright, Mrs. Jennie Just and others, is working to insure a generous response to the appeal that is being made in behalf of the children of Armenia, Persia and Syria, who are the innocent victims of Moslem persecution, disease and starvation.

The efficient business management of Near East Relief makes it possible to feed an orphan for only \$5.00 per month; to feel and shelter and provide physical, mental and moral education for \$15 a month. There are at least 250,000 children in the Near East who need food and clothing, according to latest reports from workers in the field.

Members of the county committee, who have made a study of conditions in the Near East from reports of the work abroad, and who know the generosity of their neighbors, say that this county may be depended upon to contribute money that will not only save the lives of little boys and girls whose Christian parents have been massacred by the Turks, but will educate them for a career of self-support and usefulness.

It was recently announced that Near East Relief maintains 63 hospitals that are equipped with 6,552 beds; 128 clinics for patients who do not require constant attention; 11 Rescue Homes for women and girls who have suffered from Turkish abuse, and 229 orphanages for children.

Children numbering 54,600 are cared for in the Near East Relief orphanages and 56,039 more, who receive a little assistance from relatives, are given partial support.

Food relief is being supplied to 381,970 persons in the Caucasus. The number of helpless ones served in the Anatolia-Aleppo area vary monthly with changing political conditions. For example, 10,000 rehabilitated Armenians became refugees again after the Marsh massacre.

Garments to the number of 300,000 have been received and distributed by Near East Relief, not including the thousands of garments made in our own industrial shops in the field.

With such a service record as this members of the local committee do not anticipate difficulty in securing contributions in this county to carry on the work.

RUSH PAVING WORK ON 2 COUNTY ROADS

Superintendent Russell Believes There is Chance to Complete Job This Fall

In spite of the many delays which have intervened from time to time the contractors who are laying the concrete paving on Belvidere and Volo roads are doing their best to bring their work to a point as near completion as possible before cold weather arrives.

Indications are that the Standard Paving company may complete the contract this year. The work of putting in the concrete was completed two or three days ago. This now extends to Grayslake and connects with the strip running to Hainesville. All that remains now is to complete the work of putting in the shoulder, on either side in addition to doing the grading, digging ditches for drainage purposes, etc. Charles Russell, county superintendent of highways of Lake county, says that with sufficient men employed it is possible to complete this stretch of pavement before cold weather.

Paschen Brothers, who are putting in the Volo road paving, have encountered more delays. Embargoes on building material put on by the interstate commerce commission have been the source of principal delays. Right now the contractors have sufficient sand to put in another mile of paving; they have sufficient cement to work for some time but are in need of stone. It is on shipments of stone that the commission has placed an embargo. Everything possible is being done to raise the embargo and it is hoped that this can be done within the next few days in order that the work can be rushed.

Superintendent Russell says it probably will not be possible to complete this section of pavement this year, but he is hopeful that the paving can be put in as far as the Round Lake road so that communication will not have to be broken all winter. The contractors are doing all in their power to make this possible.
