... And then Deerfield started. Deerfield had the ball on the fifty yard line. McIlwain fell back and punted. This time he redeemed himself and kicked a long high spiral which rolled back of the New Trier goal and Bolan fell on it for Deerfield's first score.
Captain Parcels kicked the goal. This put the Deerfield team in a real fighting mood and with the assistance of some of McIlwain's long, accurate passes, Deerfield scored again when Baldwin received a pretty one which netted a touchdown. Aragn Parcels kicked the goal which tied the score at the half, 14 to 14.
In the third quarter Keagle received the kickoff which he returned to the forty yard line, but he fumbled and from there New Trier worked the ball down the field from the winning touchdown to White's credit. Parker kicked the goal. The rest of the game was pure fight. Deerfield was struggling to make a score, and New Trier battling to keep them from it. And so ended the game 21 to 14.
