VICTORY MEDALS FOR FORMER MARINES

Victory medals for issue to former marines who served in the U. S. Marine corps during the World war are now being issued by the Marine corps recruiting station, 454 S. State st., Chicago. They will be furnished upon presentation of discharge or certified copy of discharge. Those former marines who reside in this vicinity will be issued the medals immediately by mailing their discharge to the Chicago office.

Officers and men of the 4th Brigade who served with the 2nd Division throughout the period of the war are entitled to wear stars on their victory ribbons for the participation in the following major operations,

Aisne defensive, 21 May to 5 June, 1918.

Aisne-Marne offensive, 18 July to 19 July, 1918.

St. Mihiel offensive, 12 September to 16 September, 1918.

Meuse-Argonne offensive, 1 October to 10 October and 1 November to 11 November, 1918.

In addition to the major operations mentioned above a defensive sector clasp is awarded for service in one or more of the following engagements:

Verdun Sector, 17 March to 5 May, 1918.

Chauteau-Thierry, 6 June to 7 July, 1918.

Marbache Sector, 1 August to 18 August, 1918.

Not more than one defensive sector clasp will be awarded to any individual, and the total number of clasps or bronze stars to which any one may be entitled are five; i. e., four battle clasps and one defensive sector clasp, with one bronze star for each clasp. In addition thereto, silver star (for gallantry citations in general orders) will be issued in accordance with information shown.

Men who served in France who are not entitled to battle clasp or defensive sector clasp are issued a clasp showing they served in France and also a Maltese Cross to wear on the ribbon.

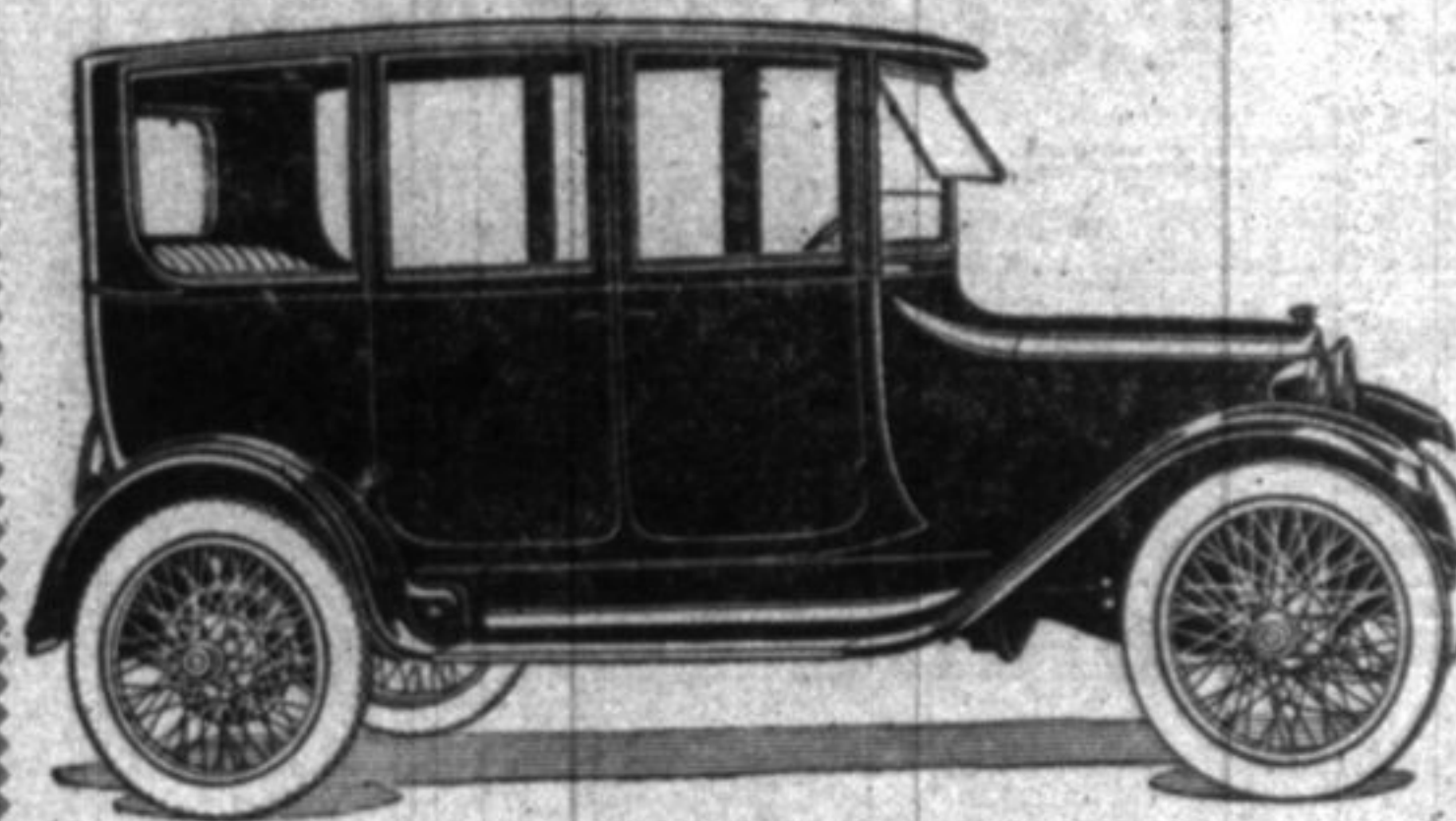
Men who served with the Transport service, Grand fleet, Overseas, Escort and Aviation, are issued a clasp and bronze star.
