south on Green Bay Road. At the intersection of Roger Williams avenue, a big car swept by, according to the boys' story and they were crowded into the ditch. Heisler was hurled to the ground and his skull fractured on the pavement. He died at the Highland Park hospital a few days later. The jury left an open verdict, and did not attach any blame.

PSYCHOLOGY OF ADVERTISING — THE ALERT STORE

Some stores are satisfied to use just the same lines of merchandise year after year.

Other stores are alert every minute to see where they can get the last dollar of value. They are constantly looking over different lines searching for special opportunities, testing out new offerings, trying to get the very best thing offered in the competitive struggle.

Such a policy involves more work. But thorough investigation of all sources of supply yields chances to buy to better advantage. Dealers realize they must make a special effort to please such a house.

Having made all this effort, such a store is not usually satisfied to sit still and let the public come in if it cares to. Its effort will be useless unless it tells the public in detail what offerings of special value it has been able to find. Hence such a concern is usually a liberal newspaper advertiser.

SEEK FREEDOM OF ACTION

Philip H. Gadsden, Chairman of the Emergency Committee of the American Gas Association, says that many gas companies are unable to obtain contracts for oil even at the prevailing top prices. It appears that the automotive industry is getting the lion's share of the available oil supply in the way of gasoline. Mr. Gadsden expresses the belief that freedom from too rigid legislation, both as to standards and to rates is the chief need of the gas interests. By giving the companies freedom to regulate their own prices in accordance with their costs, will, he believes, enable them to buy oil and other necessary supplies for manufacturing their product on an independent basis, without asking unnecessary favors from anybody. This would enable the gas companies to sell their products to the public at the same reasonable margin of profit that is required in every other industry.
