**PUBLIC LIBRARY**  
One thousand forty-three people came to the Public Library during Children's Book Week.  
There is always something worth seeking at the Public Library, every week of the year. If you didn't come last week, come this week.  
"Chamber Music" is not what you might think it, for it is not a treatise on that type of concert music, but a slight volume of lyrics. They are music, in their own sense, and they bear the same relation to epic poetry that chamber music bears to grand opera. And yet the charming collection is rightly named, for you can almost hear the melody and its accompaniment in verse XXIV:  
Silently she's combing,  
Combing her long hair,  
Silently and graciously,  
With many a pretty air. . . .  
I pray you, cease to comb out,  
Comb out your long hair,  
For I have heard the witchery  
Under a pretty air,  
That makes as one thing to the lover  
Staying and going hence,  
All fair, with many a pretty air  
And many a negligence.  
Or this picture full of restraint, pulsing with suggestion:  
The twilight turns from amethyst  
To deeper and deeper blue,  
The lamp fills with a pale green glow  
The trees of the avenue.  
The old piano plays an air,  
Sedate and slow and gay;  
She bends upon the yellow keys,  
Her head inclines this way.  
Shy thoughts and grave, wide eyes,  
and hands  
That wander as they list —  
The twilight turns to darker blue  
With lights of amethyst.  
The jaunty little poem to Golden-hair reminds one, in its essence, of Sara Teasdale's lyrics. It is piquant. Others remind one of those immortal, and much neglected poems which bear the name Songs of Solomon, full of passion and rare dignity.
