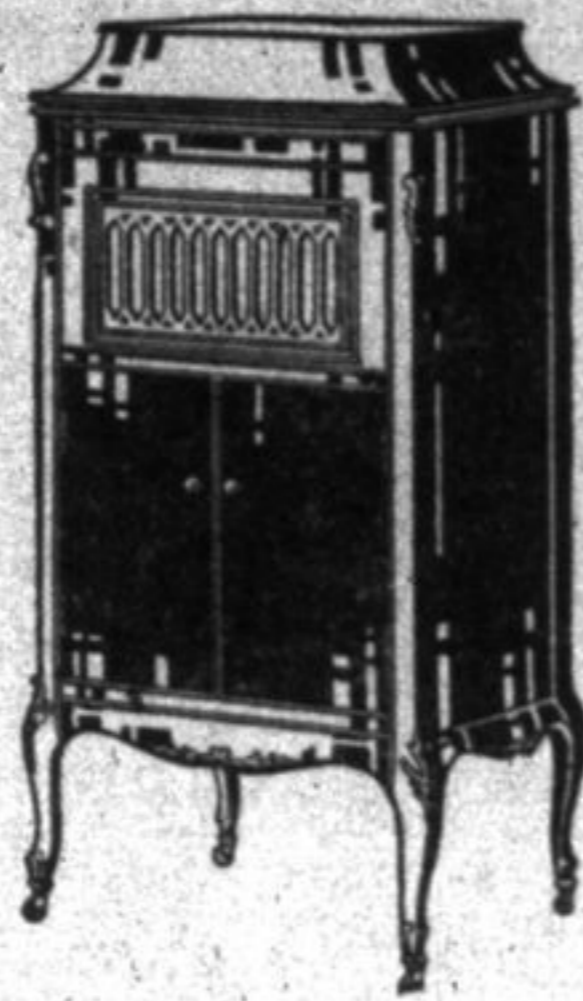

The story hour is such fun! Every Saturday morning we have a story hour just before luncheon. Come at a little before eleven and bring all your friends. Mrs. Leo (who told stories the first afternoon of Children Book Week, and while Milo Winter sketched at the Woman's Club fair) will tell more of her jolly stories every Saturday morning at the Highland Park Public Library.

"Washington, the Man Who Made Us" by Percy MacKaye is having a bit of popularity, awakened by the demand for John Drinkwater's "Abraham Lincoln." All who have seen that tremendous drama are moved to read more about Lincoln, and the great men of other times also. A small bulletin listing some of the books about Lincoln, both fiction and biography, hangs over the new book case.

"Democracy and World Relations" by David Starr Jordan, has the recommendation of being on the teachers reading list for this year.

"An American in the Making" is the life story of an immigrant by M. E. Ravage, bearing strong and peculiar significance to everyone who is interested in the great problem of assimilation into our national life—and our own home life, in many instances!—the thousands of foreigners who come to the United States. In one week last month seventy-three thousand foreigners came to this country. Some of them came to Highland Park, some to Highwood. You may be passing some of them on the street today, or teaching some of them to serve you in your home. Can you say that the problem of Americanization is not yours? Read such books as this, assume the new-comers point of view, your sympathy will go so long a way to making life for yourself easier. Other books which are as interesting as novels which are written by new Americans, or about them are:

Mary Antin's *Promised Land*.
 Against the Current by Steiner.
 Little Citizens by Myra Kelly.
 A Far Journey by Ribhany.
 "Caliban" by W. L. George is a novel of "flesh and blood people in a compelling story."
 "New Schools for Old" by Evelyn Dewey describes the regeneration of a small and isolated rural school and how, through the devotion and energy of the teacher, it became the center and mainspring of community life and mainspring of community life a large city this volume brings suggestion.

"The Skeleton Key" by Bernard Capes—a detective story.

"The Purple Heights" a new novel by the author of "Slippery McGee" and "The Woman Named Smith."

"Wild Fire"—just a new copy of an old favorite by Zane Grey.

"Blind" by Ernest Poole; a story of these times.
 "In Chancery" by John Galsworthy, who wrote "The Country House", "The Man of Property", "The Patricians", "Tatterdemalion" and many others.

"Roaming Through the West Indies" by Harry A. Franch is another much desired book on the much-read about South Seas region. The author has written "Vagabonding Through Changing Germany," "Vagabonding Down the Andes" and other equally enthralling volumes of personal adventure and travel. Other books on the South Seas which you will want to read are:

"White Shadows in the South Seas" by O'Brien.

"The South Seas" by Robert Louis Stevenson who discovered them and tried long ago to make us love them.

"Vialima Letters" by Stevenson.

"Erskine Dale, Pioneer" is a new novel by John Fox, Jr., author of "The Little Shepherd of Kingdom Come," "The Trail of the Lonesome Pine," "The Heart of the Hills" and other equally fine novels.

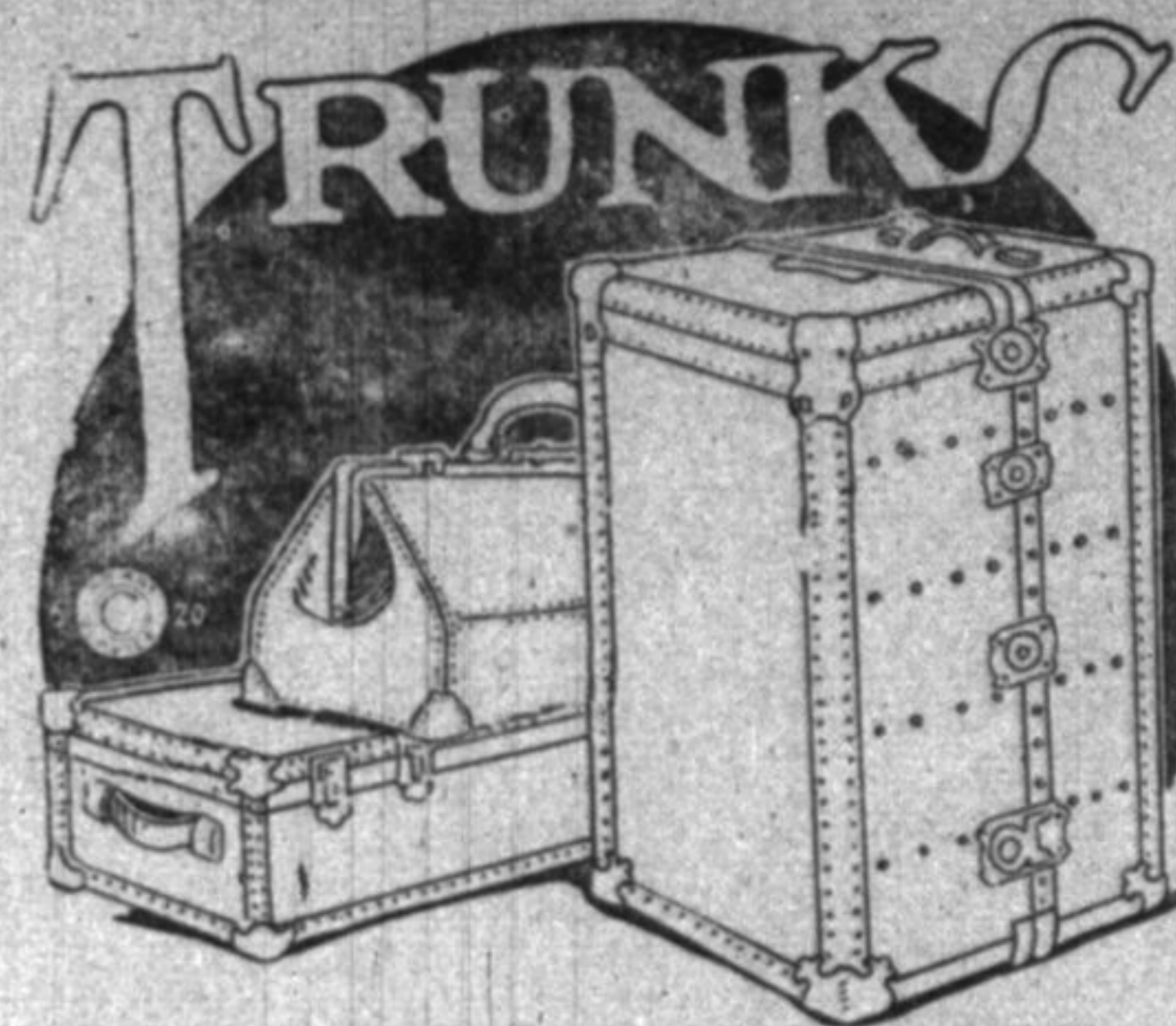
"West Wind Drift" is a new novel by George Barr McCutcheon.

At Fields' Book Fair I asked the publisher's representative "Is that really as 'slushy' as it sounds?" pointing to Berta Ruck Onions new book. He said it is. I have not read it, but I think the chances are that the book is about as invigorating as gingerale punch, and perhaps that is to be preferred (for the young and nearly young) to the highly intoxicating and none too nourishing diet of the majority of best sellers. "The Bridge of Kisses" will probably be as popular as "Sweethearts Unmet" and "His Official Fiance" which were, after all's said and done, "perfectly good stories!"

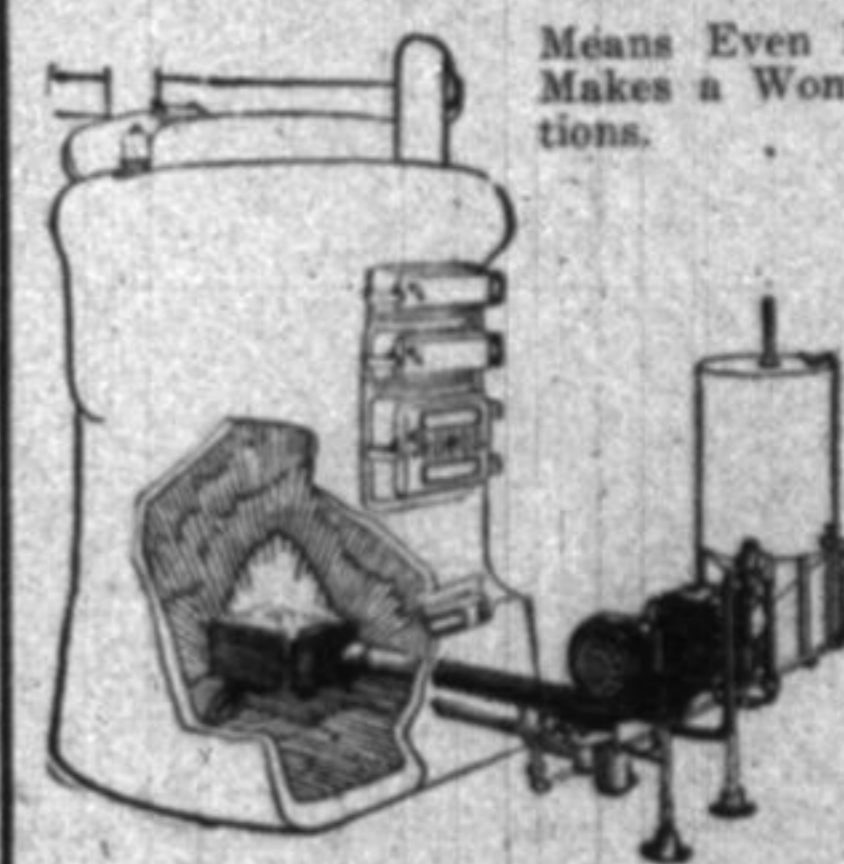
