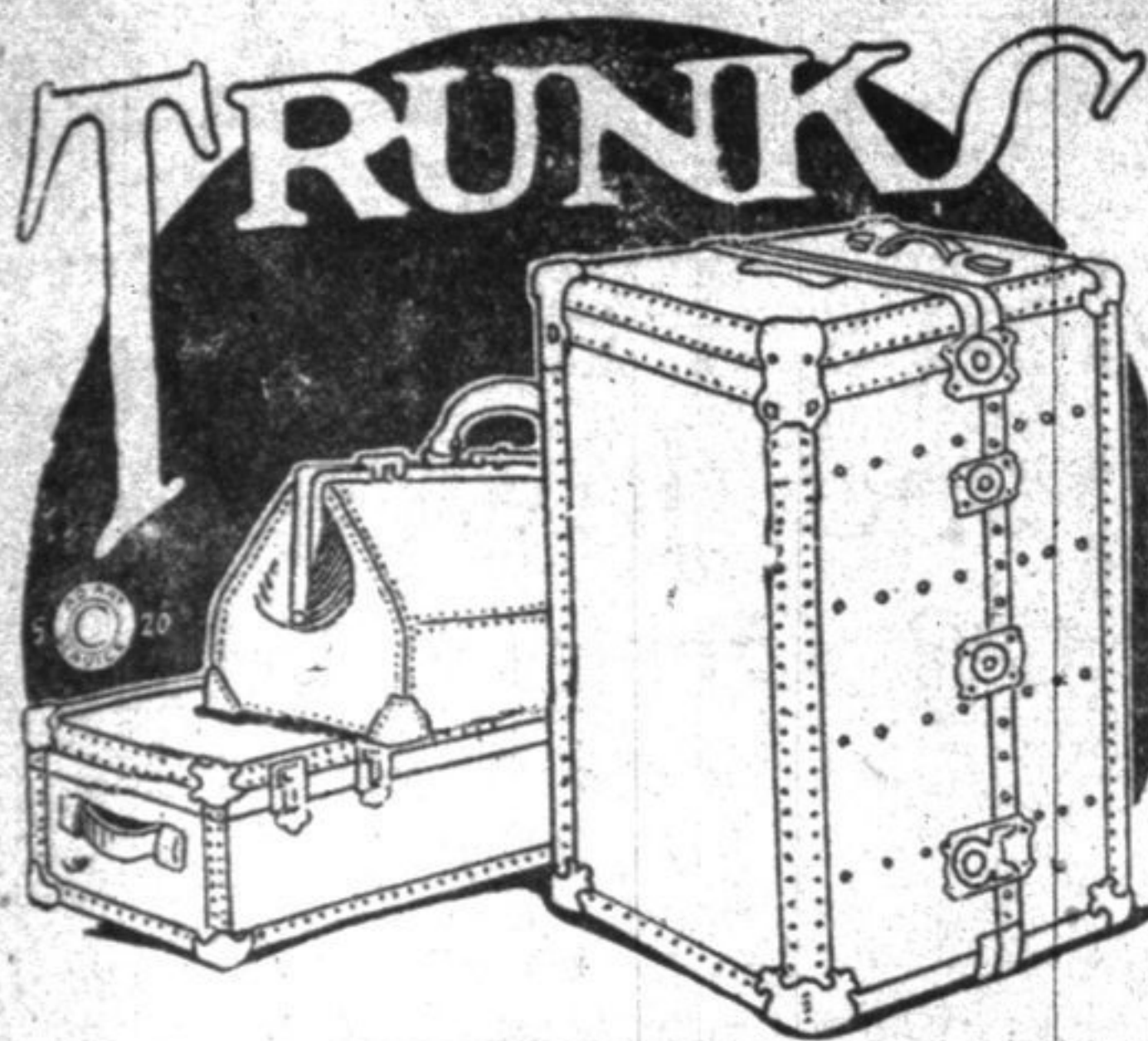

### UNITED EVANGELICAL CHURCH

The Philathea and Baraca classes of the Sunday school held their regular monthly meetings Tuesday night of this week, the former at the home of Mrs. Helen Abercromby, Lincoln place; and the latter at the home of Milton Tillman on Central ave.

The regular prayer meeting will be held on Wednesday night, the senior class meeting at the home of Abraham Snyder on S. Green Bay road.

On Thursday afternoon at 3 the Primary department of the Sunday school will hold their Christmas program in the auditorium of the church. The scholars and their mothers will be given a reception in the basement of the church and refreshments will be served.

The main school will celebrate Christmas on Thursday evening, beginning at 7:30 when a beautiful Christmas cantata will be given by the choir assisted by many of the scholars of the Sunday school. An offering will be received for the Home Mission work of the denomination.

An earnest appeal from the Federal council of the churches for funds to take care of the starving people of Europe will be answered by this church in a liberal way during the holiday season.

### TRINITY CHURCH

As Christmas comes on Saturday this year the order of services will be slightly changed. The Children's Mystery Play will be on Sunday afternoon at four o'clock.

All offerings next Sunday morning, December 19, except those specially designated, will be given to the relief fund for the starving children of Central and Eastern Europe.

### PUBLIC LIBRARY

#### NOTICE

On and after January 1, 1921, all over-due books will be charged for at the rate of three cents a day fine, instead of two cents a day as heretofore. Books from the Rent collection will be charged for at the rate of ten cents a week for the first week, and three cents a day thereafter. This ruling of the Board of Trustees of the public library supercedes all other rulings on this subject. Users of the public library take notice. Do not have fines; return your books on-time, or have them renewed. No increase in cost of the use of the library is made for people who conform to the time-limit regulations. So many users of the rental collection have requested the day-rate charge on books for the second week that they have been arranged to conform with the same charge for overtime use as the over-due two-weeks books and the seven-day books. Notices to this effect have been posted in the public library for a week.

The story hour next Saturday morning in the children's room at the public library will begin at 11 o'clock as usual. Mrs. Leo promises us an especial Christmas treat:
