Delegate from this District Appointed Chairman of Phraseology Committee

Elam L. Clark, of Waukegan, has been appointed chairman of the committee on phraseology and style of the constitutional convention to succeed Delegate Charles H. Hamil, of Chicago, who resigned that post. Edward H. Brewster, of Dixon, was appointed to fill the vacancy on the same committee caused by Delegate Clarke's appointment. At the same time, President Charles E. Woodward, of Ottawa, accepted Delegate Clarke's resignation as editor of convention debate.

Mr. Clark is a well known Waukegan attorney, former master in chancery, member of the city and high school boards of education. He with Frank Whitman of Belvidere was chosen delegate from this district to the convention.


PERIOD OF WATCHFUL WAITING AT HAND

But "watchful waiting" is given a new significance by the fact that the Wilson Administration will have much to propose during the coming three months, while Congress will pursue the policy of "watchful waiting" or "nothing doing" until the Harding administration goes into effect.

This same condition followed the defeat of former President Taft eight years ago, when Congress sewed up all his plans and suggestions in a political bag, which they put in storage until after he had taken the train out of Washington.
