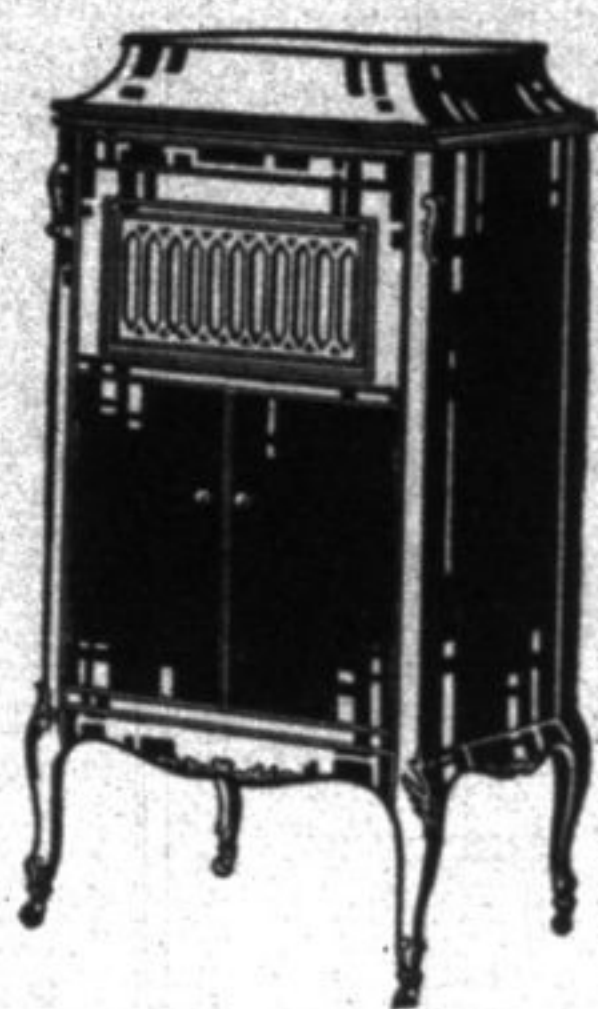

GREAT LAKES TEAM RETURNS FROM TRIP

Won Silver Trophy in the East by Defeating Hampton Roads Team

The Great Lakes football team came back last week from its trip east and when the warriors reached the station they found jackies lined up from the parade ground clear to the main gate. And, the boys who had won honors in the east and brought back the silver cup marched down between the lines and were cheered lustily. It proved to be a great day for the football players and the fans enjoyed themselves. There were at least 8000 men in the line.

The team has had a splendid record for the season and capped the climax when, by defeating Hampton Roads in the east recently, they won the triangular contest which included Newport. Newport had lost to Hampton Roads 42 to 7, but Great Lakes walloped the Hampton Roads 28 to 7 and thus brought back the cup which must be won three times to keep permanently.

The marines were champions of the eastern training station.

Captain Rodes was proud of the work on his team. There is a rule which permits but one officer on a team and Capt. Rodes was the one assigned. He is an ensign and was on the Annapolis team in 1919.

85 BIRTHS AGAINST 40 DEATHS IN ZION

Only Two Children's Deaths Reported; Overseer Pleased with City's Record

The City of Zion is on the map for marriages as well as births. Out of a population of 5,672 there has been thirty-four marriages, 85 births and 40 deaths. These figures, given out by City Health Officer Dr. J. H. Blanks, show that the births are double the deaths, plus five. Of the 40 deaths, 15 of the persons were 61 to 82 years of age, and seven were from 50 to 58. On the list, there are but two children who passed away during the 11 months, one six years old and the other eight. There are but two others under 20 years of age. It is interesting also to note that among the 85 births, there were five pairs of twins.

"That is a remarkable record," said Wilbur Glenn Voliva, overseer of Zion, as he reviewed this record submitted by the health officer. "Think of the vast army of children we have here, and we have had only two deaths among all these children in 11 months. Where is there any place in the United States, Canada, Australia, England, or any other country that can show such a record? I thank God for that record!"

RAILROADS ASK INCREASE

Petition Sent to Interstate Commerce Commission; Would Affect 38,000 on North Shore

The fare between this city and Chicago on the Chicago and Northwestern railway may be raised 20 per cent if the petition made last week to the Interstate Commerce Commission by the various Chicago railroads is granted.

The proposed rate raise would affect 100,000 commuters, 38,000 of whom live on the north shore and use the Chicago and Northwestern railway. The proposed boost would include excess baggage, excursions, milk, and all other fares exempted in the last rate advance from 3 to 3.6 cents per mile.

Shortly after the petition was wired to Washington, a reply was received in Chicago, stating that a commissioner would be immediately sent to Chicago, to carry on an investigation. The report that the rate increase that went into effect last week extended to commuters was erroneous. The proposed increase will be the first to touch suburban traffic, which has so far been exempted on the ground that commuters had semi-vested rights in low rates.

The report of the investigators will no doubt be made in the near future. Until then the price of tickets to Chicago will remain the same as ever.
