REVIEW OF CRIMES FOR THREE MONTHS

ESTIMATE IS SUBMITTED

Treasury Department Favors a Large Appropriation for the Naval Station Next Year

Among the estimates of the next fiscal year submitted to congress by the treasury department is one for \$750,000 for the Great Lakes Naval Training station. It is expected that this appropriation will be allowed.

This large appropriation will permit the continuation of work on the mammoth harbor at the station. Work on this has been carried forward quite rapidly but it is desired by the executives of the station to complete it as soon as possible. The appropriation asked for next year is sufficiently large to permit extensive work.

There are other improvements at the station which the three quarters of a million dollars appropriation will permit. While the amount asked is considerable it is no larger than was granted last year and is by no means as big as appropriations that were made during the war when hundreds of barracks and other buildings were going up. The fact that so much money is needed for next year, the further fact that there are about 11,000 men at the station now with more arriving in large numbers, shows an intention on the part of the navy department to maintain the local station as one of the most important in the world.

Reports of officers show the fair this year ends the season with a net balance of about \$1350 after all bills are paid, including many old bills that the present regime took over when it assumed charge of the fair.

The receipts of the fair this year were about \$15,000 and the expenses a little over \$1,300.

The meeting was attended by about forty men and they discussed the future of the fair.

FIND DIFFICULTY IN GETTING JURYMEN

Supervisors Not Careful Enough in Selecting Men, Says Judge Edwards

Judge Edwards has announced his intention of taking up with members of the county board of supervisors the matter of exercising a little more care in the selection of men for jury duty. The difficulty encountered in obtaining sufficient men to serve on juries is the cause of the judge's contemplated action.

Out of the panel of thirty-six veniremen summoned to appear for service early last week, it was possible to obtain the services of but twelve men. There were several excuses given by the men who were able to get out of serving.

One of the jurors was a city fireman — another was in the mail service — both occupations are exempt from jury service; another man could not speak English, two others had defective hearing, and several were over the age of 65 years which grants them exemption in case they demand it. There were other reasons which obtained exemption. One or two men escaped because their deaths have been duly recorded.

"Supervisors should be careful about selecting men for jury service," Judge Edwards said. "They should not place in the box the names of men

whom they should know are over the exemption age. If there was a little more care along this line we would not have so much difficulty in obtaining juries. It is a needless expense when we summon men who are entitled to exemption — then, too, it takes up valuable time sending for more jurors and perhaps we will have no better success with them."

There are a few men who have been called for service twice and even three times during the last few months. This is due to the fact that their names have been placed in the box twice. In a number of cases where men have been called successively the court has excused them.

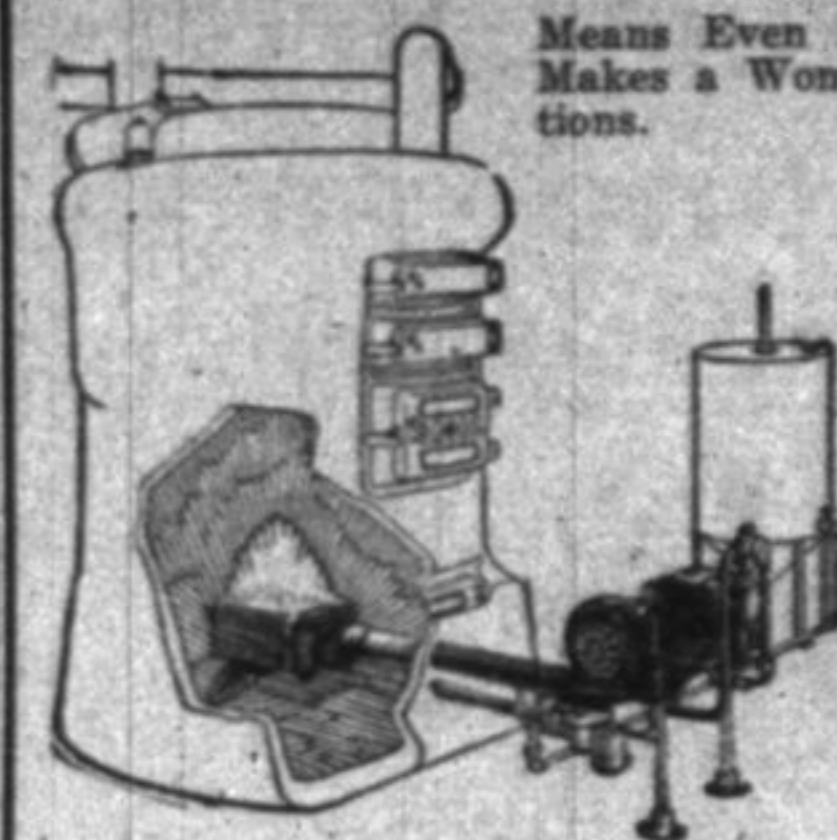

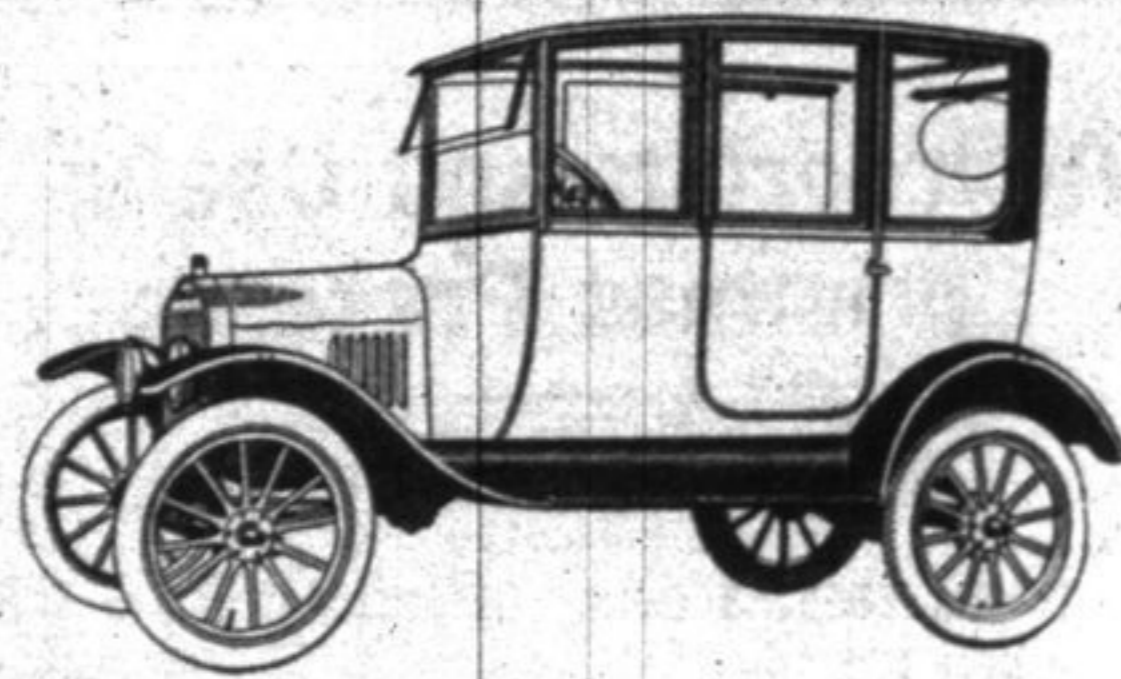
