SQUALOR SURROUNDS PERFECT BOOZE STILL

CONFISCATE MUCH LIQUOR

Smith's Forces Continue Drive Against Moonshiners; Other Interesting Items of Lake County News

Surrounded by the most abject features of squalor imaginable, the booze raiding constables of Waukegan, Clarence Hicks and Del Weale, last Friday discovered one of the most perfect outfits of stills that has been found in the recent raids against violators of the liquor law. The apparatus was uncovered at a place occupied by Andrew Loozer, 207, Low avenue. The various rooms disclosed the following stock: Four barrels of mash, two barrels of wine, one ten-gallon keg of "white mule," and one five-gallon keg of "white mule." The operations of the whiskey manufacturers were carried on in the upper part of the house, and the family lived downstairs. The Loozers are Austrians.

The Beebe hardware store in Zion was robbed of 42 boxes of knives valued at \$300 last week. A reward of \$50 has been offered by Chief of Police Becker Zion for the conviction of the thieves.

The Rev. James Frothingham, former pastor of the Presbyterian church in Waukegan, and distinguished as the grand nephew of Washington Irving, died last week at his home in Chicago. He was associate pastor of the Hyde Park Presbyterian church.

Farmers will receive \$2.60 per hundred pounds for their December milk delivered to the distributing companies, this rate being agreed to after a conference of the Co-Operative Milk Marketing company and representatives of the buying concerns held in Chicago last week. This price is 45 cents lower than the November price.

Waukegan people of Jewish faith have just completed a drive for funds for European relief work, for the development of Palestine, and aid for immigrants, the total sum raised being \$2,500.

One hundred pounds of white flour and one hundred pounds of granulated sugar is the Christmas present which Alex Hein, prominent Waukegan merchant will send to his mother, Frau Cecelia Hein, 11 Schafer Strasse, Berlin, Germany. The shipping charges amount to much more than the original cost of the goods.

Swooping down upon "Marie's place", notorious road house on the east bank of Fourth lake, which for many years has created talk about its free and easy interpretation of the law, constables last week arrested the proprietors, and seized gambling devices of all kinds and a quantity of booze. The raiders returned to Waukegan with a truck load of plunder.

New duties have not yet been assigned to Capt. W. A. Moffett, former commander of the Great Lakes naval training station, who has just been transferred from the command of the U. S. S. Mississippi, one of the vessels of the Pacific fleet. Capt. Moffett is expected to make a quick trip to Chicago.

Records on file at the police station in Waukegan show that there has been a marked decrease in the number of contagious diseases in that city.

Alfred Johnson, proprietor of the Maple Grove Dairy, Waukegan, last Wednesday was fined \$60 and costs by Justice Leo F. Farmer for violation of the food and dairy laws, the fines comprising four violations, \$15 in each instance. The milk he sold was claimed to be below the requirements in butter fats.

Two full barrels of wine and two more of mash were seized at the place of Andrew Lenarsick, Waukegan, last week. This was the twentieth place to be raided since State's Attorney A. V. Smith started his cleanup two weeks ago.

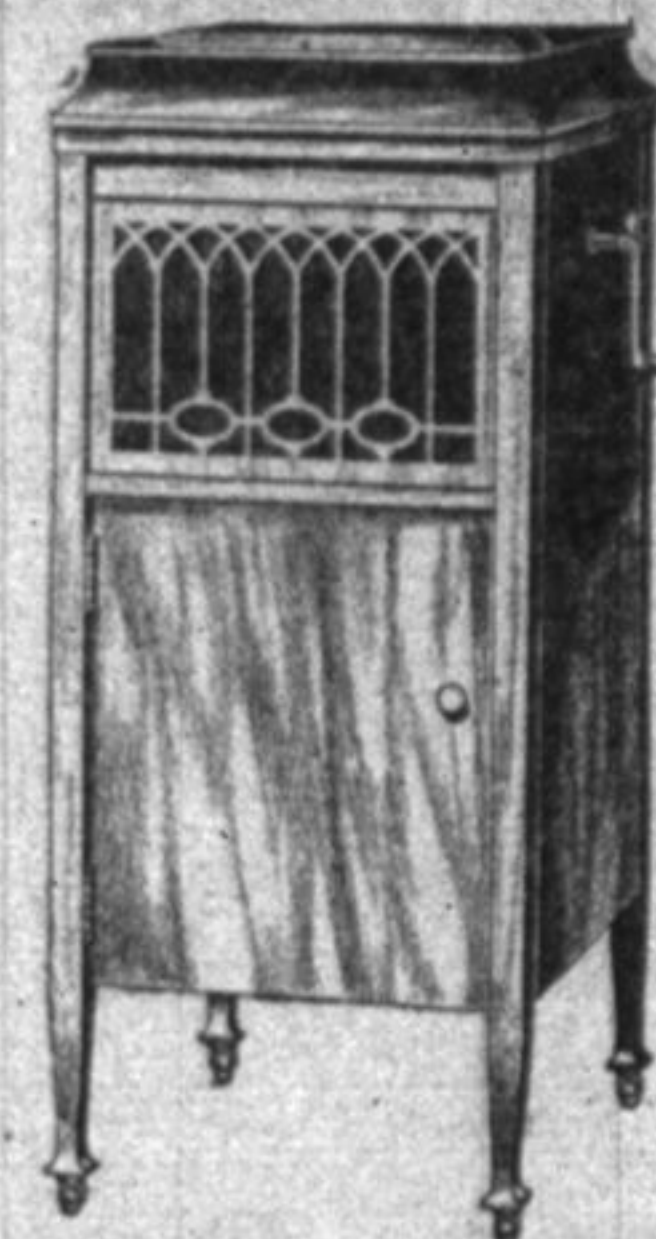

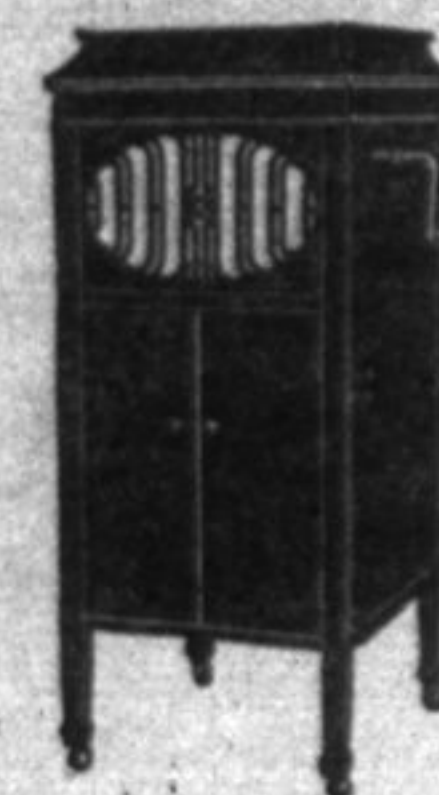
