

A warning against holiday fire dangers in the home has been issued by State Fire Marshall John G. Gamber. "Every year many children are burned to death by fire from Christ-

mas candles," reads the warning. "Do not decorate the Christmas tree with paper, cotton or any other inflammable material. Use metallic tinsel and non-inflammable decorations only. Set the tree securely so

that it will not be tipped over. not use cotton to represent Use powdered mica or as-

"Do not permit children to light or relight the candles. They are apt to set fire to their clothing or to the tree. Keep matches out of reach of

"Do not allow tree inside of building after holidays, as the needles, when dry, ignite readily.

#### FARM MACHINERY GOES TO BORNEO JUNGLES

A large quantity of modern farm machinery, including plows, cultivators and a tractor, for use in the cultivation of new rice fields in the jungles of Sarawak, Borneo, to relieve the rice famine there, has been shipped by the Board of Foreign Missions of the Methodist Episcopal church, according to an announcement today by the Rev. J. W. Van Cleve, secretary of the Chicago area, committee on conservation and advance. The shipment was aboard the Pacific Mail steamship Venezuela, which sailed from San Francisco on Saturday, Dec. 11, for Singapore. The Rev. John J. M. Hoover of Chambersburg, Pa., Methodist missionary to Borneo, purchased the machinery in this country and is returning to direct its use in the rice jungle clearings where the new rice fields are located. So acute is the rice famine that the mission colony is forced to plant rubber land in rice which is worth ten times as much in para

"The sending of the power machinery is expected to save the situation for the mission colony in Sibu, on the River Rejang," said Dr. Van Cleve. "Rice is almost unobtainable in Malayyasia now, and the situation is daily growing worse due to the famine conditions in China and India, where are situated the largest rice regions of the Orient. The colony of Sibu is composed of 10,000 Christian Chinese emigrants from the coast cities of south China who came to Borneo in a colonization scheme under the Methodist Board of Foreign Missions.

When Mr. Hoover took charge at the special request of the white Rajah Brooke II, predecessor of the reigning Rajah Brooke, also a white man and an Englishman; absolute monarch of the principality of Sarawak, there were only 500 sickly Chinese who knew nothing but failure in farming the jungle clearings. Now it is a prosperous rubber colony with three trading centers on the river. Different kinds of rubber grow wild in the jungles of Sarawak, and para trees mature in four years as compared with six years elsewhere. Notwithstanding this prosperity, the rice shortage is so acute that Mr. Hoover is returning to Sarawak immediately without taking his furlough of one year due every missionary at the end of five years' service abroad.

Mr. Hoover has also installed two power rice mills at Sibu to provide for hulling the crop. By the native method of pounding, two men and a woman work a day to hull a single bag of rice, and a large crop cannot be hulled before it sours in the hot, damp climate. The native population of Sarawak are Malays and head-hunting Dyaks who live in crude log houses in the bush and refuse to receive the benefits of civilization. The jungle is marvellously rich in hardwoods and minerals, but is explored only a short distance. Last year the Chinese gathered and exported more than \$250,-000 worth of nuts which floated down the river from the forests of the in-
