PLAN TO ENFORCE STRICTER SUNDAYS

EFFECTS THE DANCE HALLS

Aim to Squelch Sunday Good Times in Waukegan.— Other Items of County News

Leaders of seven churches in Waukegan and surrounding towns met 200 strong Thursday night of last week in the banquet rooms of the First Methodist church, organized the Community Church Council, elected officers, and made plans to take up and eliminate commercialized Sunday amusements that they believe harmful to the community. Sunday dance halls, pool and billiard parlors, and uncensored motion pictures all stand in the line of fire. The third Tuesday of each month has been set aside for meeting night, and the Council will gather at that time in one of the churches, the Y. M. C. A. or the Salvation Army building.

The Lake County Board of Supervisors has named Philo Burgess of Waukegan as superintendent of the county poor farm at Libertyville. Mr. Burgess has been in charge of the county road outfit for the past two years. Henry Lawrence of Libertyville, another candidate, ran a close race for the office. The new superintendent will take up his new duties immediately, it is understood.

A new roundhouse is being constructed by the Palatine, Lake Zurich & Wauconda railroad at Wauconda. This building will shelter two gas cars and two locomotives, the greater part of the railroad's rolling stock. A brighter future for the railroad is seen.

That the year 1923 will see the end of this era of dispensation is prophesied by Overseer Wilbur Glen Voliva of Zion, according to a recent report, which goes on to state that every 24 hours sees closer the end of the period of strikes, wars, famines, and pestilences; and the approach of the Second Coming of Christ.

A large picture of President-elect Harding in the county court house was ruined last Thursday when John A. Bowers, a man who was being tried for his sanity, mistook the picture for that of a king, and seized with democratic frenzy, he smashed a bottle of ink on it.

The small pox "epidemic" in Waukegan ended last week, when the health authorities fumigated the home of Joseph Herberger. Quarantine records show that this was the only case of the disease in the city.

Benjamin Spence, of Canada, who has recently been in Milwaukee to investigate the alleged traffic in liquor between Canada and this country declared there recently that he had information which leads him to believe that Kenosha is the landing place for Canadian whiskey, and that Kenosha is the distributing point of liquor for Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, and Iowa.

Edward H. Sweitzer, a Waukegan drug clerk, was sentenced to six months in jail and fined \$1,000 by Judge Landis last week for selling liquor. He admitted selling drinks at thirty cents a "shot" to favored customers. Sweitzer was formerly a partner in the Liberty drug store in Waukegan.

Thousands of gallons of wine, "white mule" and other kinds of booze which was seized by State's Attorney A. V. Smith's crew of rangers during the last two weeks, is causing the county court house to smell like a young distillery, and those in charge have begun to be worried about protecting such a large trove of liquor treasure.

A raid by Sheriff Green and Assistant Chief of Police Tyrrel of Waukegan, last Saturday, resulted in the seizing of a regulation moonshine still, two jugs of whiskey, and two barrels of wine at the home of George Horrat, 310 Clinton street, Waukegan. Horrat denied the charge that he was operating a blind pig. He was locked in the county jail when he failed to provide the necessary \$2,000 bonds.

A charter has been issued for the Zion bank. The Zion State Bank is incorporated with a capital of \$25,000 and a surplus of \$5,000. The officers of the bank are: Wilbur Glenn Voliva, President. W. Hurd Clendenin, Vice-president. W. J. Bull, Cashier. W. J. Armstrong, Assistant-Cashier.

A fleet of O'Connell motor trucks, made in Waukegan, were driven through to Chicago last week. They were valued at \$65,000, and were sold to the city of Chicago.
