Helen Caroline Peterson Helen Caroline came from the trailing clouds of glory to bless and gladden the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. H. W. Peterson on Tuesday, March 21, 1916, at Detroit, Mich. Her coming into this world with all its sorrows, selfishness and sin did not detract from the radiance and joy of her pure and innocent life. To all who knew her and who had studied the only revelation given in words, the Bible she spoke the language of God and Heaven.

Helen did not possess a rugged body but gave promise of a vigorous and healthy growth. Mentally she was very alert and eagerly appropriated the information that came to her. Her personality was most winsome and abounded with exuberant life. But on Thursday, Dec. 16, she was taken sick. Her illness was not thought serious until on Friday when a physician was called. On Monday a child specialist was called in consultation and on Tuesday the specialist and attending surgeon consulted with the physicians. But her ailment baffled all the efforts of medical science and on Tuesday evening she was taken to the Highland Park hospital in the hope that an operation might be accomplished. This course could not be followed and on Tuesday night, Dec. 21, 1920, at the age of four years, nine months, she returned to Him who had said "Suffer the little children to come unto me and forbid them not; for of such is the kingdom of heaven."

Of such thy kingdom—Teach thou us, O Master most divine, To feel the deep significance Of these wise words of thine.

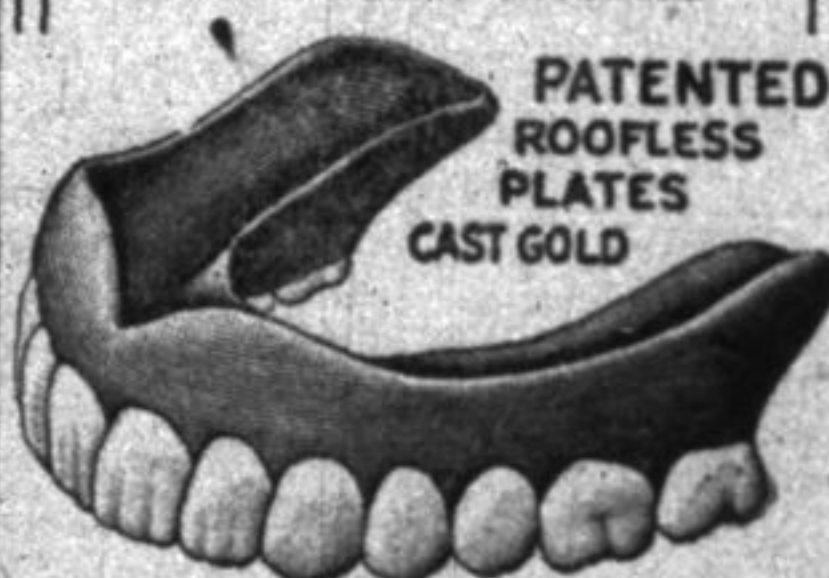
The haughty eye shall seek in vain What innocents behold; No cunning finds the key to heaven, No strength its gate unfolds.
