CHECK IMMIGRATION FOR AT LEAST A YEAR

Congress is clamping the lid down upon indiscriminate immigration, and the flood of foreigners who have been rushing to our shores is to be checked for at least a year. The immigrants to be admitted will come here under very stringent regulations, the chief of which will be that they will join relatives who are already American citizens. Here we have a condition where our own citizens stand as sponsors for foreigners who are permitted to land upon our shores. Obviously the proper thing to do is to close the ports of the United States to immigrants until conditions in this country have resumed a normal status. Then they can be opened upon terms which will insure the admission of only those foreigners who come with a high respect for the American government and its institutions and with a desire to become American citizens.

RESENT RULES AGAINST UNVACCINATED PUPILS

Resolutions Adopted at Mass Meeting at Kimball Hall on December 17

Whereas, the Chicago Department of health claims, and the board of education assents thereto, that the exclusion of unvaccinated children from school is a protection of the public health, and

Whereas, the excluded children are permitted to go where they will outside of school, and to mingle with all

classes of people, unvaccinated as well as vaccinated, and

Whereas, the children remaining in school are the best-vaccinated class in the community, so that, if vaccination protects, the admission into school of the unvaccinated could harm no one,

Therefore, we denounce exclusion as a mere pretense and pretext, employed to mask the purpose of the health department to compel obedience to its demands and to punish citizens who stand on their constitutional rights,

Whereas, further, the discrimination exercised in our free public schools against children whose par-

ents object to vaccination and medical inspection, is often harsh and always unfair, undemocratic and so, un-American,

We call upon the school authorities to order forthwith the cessation of all such discrimination and persecution.

And, Whereas, the law and court decisions in Illinois do not support any order to vaccinate the unwilling; and if such justification did exist in law or court decision, the same would be illegal because in violation of the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the Constitution of the United States, and

Whereas, the Principals of the public schools are now permitting themselves to be made cats-paw of the department of health, therefore

Resolved: That it is the sense of this meeting that notice is hereby served on said Principals that all parents should, and so far as the Medical Liberty League of Chicago is concerned will, demand and insist — in the courts if necessary — that Principals fulfill their duty to the children and refuse henceforth to exclude children on the order of health department agents for non-vaccination or non-inspection.
