"HELPLESS WITHOUT AIRSHIPS," MOFFETT

PLANE WILL BE FLAGSHIP

Captain W. A. Moffett on Visit Here Predicts Future of the Air Fleet

"The fleet of the future that is without adequate support of a naval air force will be most helpless," Capt. W. A. Moffett, said last week. "In fact I believe that the flagship of the future will be a fast two seated battle plane, and that the commanding officer will occupy the observer's cockpit of that ship during the engagements."

Capt. Moffett left Lake Forest, where he had been spending a short holiday on Jan. 2. He went to Washington to take up his duties as head of the naval air forces of the United States.

"Fighting men of the sea are realizing more every day the paramount importance of an air force that can properly co-operate with the fleet," he continued. "Almost every power of the world is making extensive plans for the formation of perfection of naval air fighting forces."

"That the United States must have an aerial fighting force composed of men familiar with the sea to work hand in hand with our navy is known to most of the administrative officers in Washington. Work toward the accomplishment of this has already been commenced. How far it has progressed I cannot say."

"I am not entirely familiar with present conditions of the United States air forces, but from what information I possess I believe we should have three divisions of aviation. We should have an army air service. We should have a naval air service and a commercial aviation department. Each should be distinctly separate from the other."

"The naval air forces should make their own experiments, order their own ships and train their own men. So should it be with the army air service. The commercial department could be handled in the same manner."

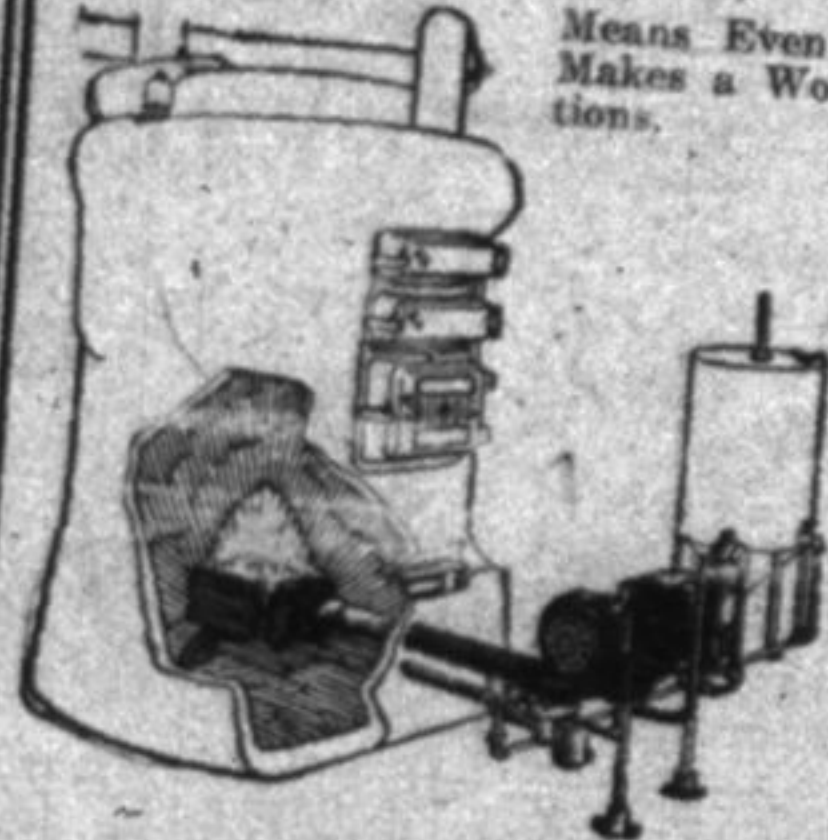
"I also believe—mind, I am talking from my present views, which may be changed after I have been in Washington a few days—that all of the three air forces as referred to should patronize commercial aircraft manufacturing companies. If we do not support the commercial companies we will find ourselves in another hole if war breaks out suddenly."

"The aircraft manufacturers of America must be supported. They have to live, and commercial aviation hasn't progressed to the extent that it will support our airplane companies."
