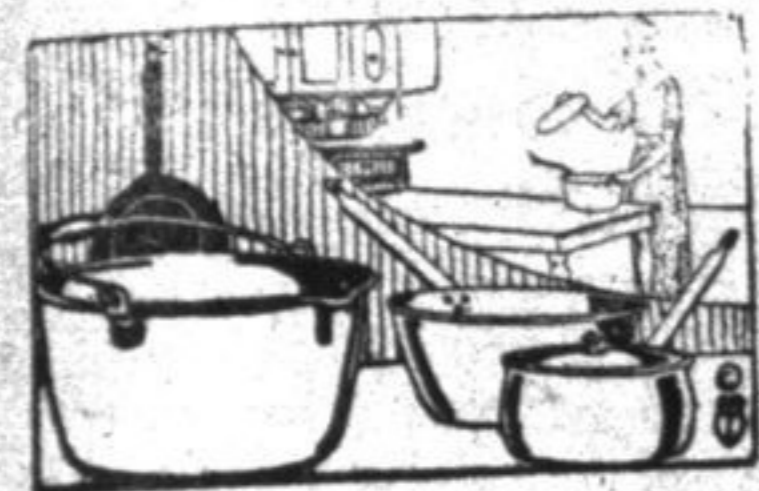


THE BIG CLEARANCE IS ON
