ARREST EX-CONVICT WHO WAS PAROLED

Hans Christensen Returned to Joliet After Another Offense as Burglar

Hans Christensen, ex-convict, on parole from the state penitentiary at Joliet, was arrested yesterday afternoon when he attempted to enter the home of W. Bross Lloyd, prominent Socialist and radical, at Winnetka. Christensen was arrested in Highland Park three years ago by Officers Sheahan and Grant, after he had burglarized the George F. Pick home. Justice of the Peace A. E. Smith held the man over to the grand jury. He was found guilty by the circuit court and was sentenced to serve from one to fourteen years at Joliet. Later he was paroled by the state parole board, and given the opportunity again to prey upon the public.

Yesterday afternoon he was taken by the Winnetka police to the Joliet parole officers. He will be again placed in the penitentiary to complete his sentence.

SPANISH AMERICAN WAR VETERAN DIES

August B. Siefert of Highwood Died Friday Morning Following Three Weeks Illness

Mr. August B. Siefert of Highwood passed away Friday morning at his home following a three weeks illness of kidney trouble.

He was born July 26, 1850, in Benzheim, Germany, coming to this country in 1865. He has made his home in Highwood for the past twenty eight years. Mr. Siefert is a retired soldier having served with the U. S. Army for thirty years. He served with General Custer during the Spanish American War.

Funeral services were held from the family residence Monday morning with burial in Ft. Sheridan cemetery.

He leaves three daughters, Mrs. J. Grant of Chicago, Irene and Esther and two sons, Raymond and Lloyd and one grandchild to survive him.

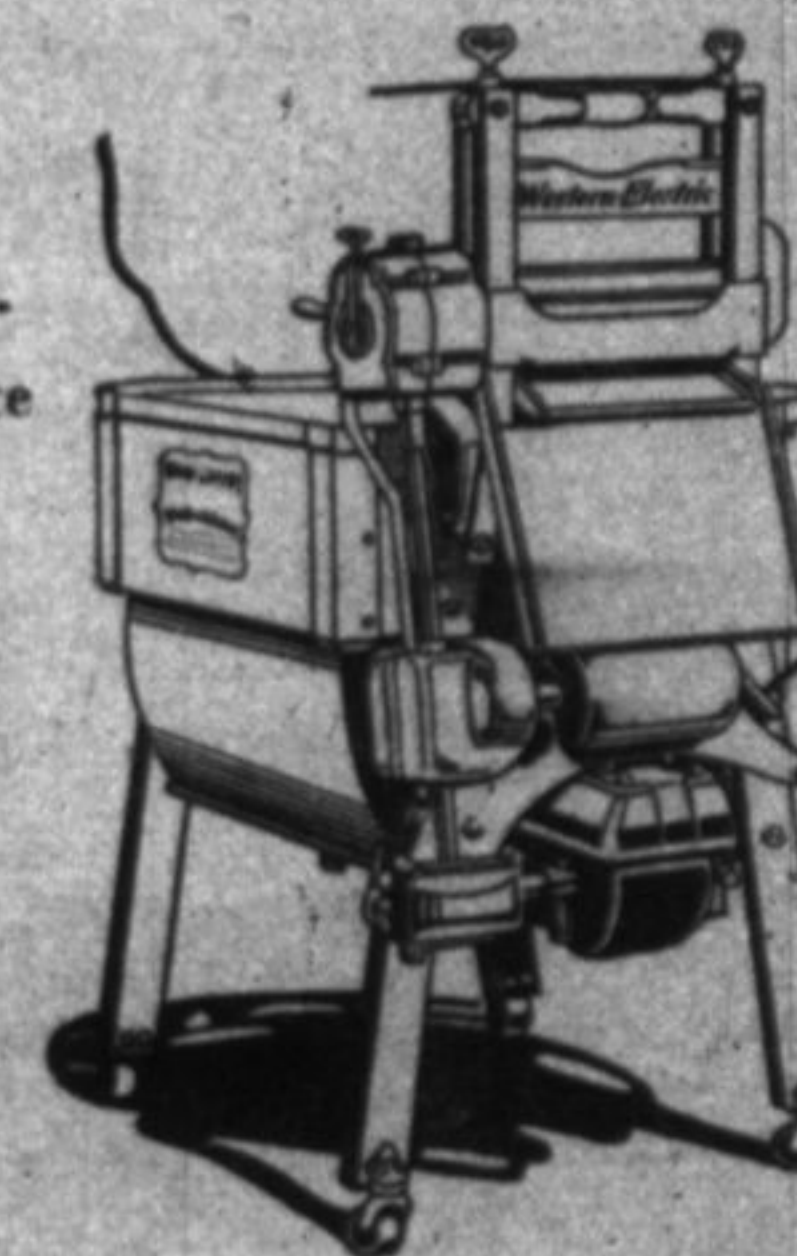
