INTERESTING LECTURE GIVEN ON LABRADOR

Miss Moseley Speaks Sunday at Presbyterian Church on Work With Grenfell Mission

Last Sunday night a congregation which taxed the seating capacity of the Lecture Room of the Presbyterian church listened to a very brilliant lecture on the needs of the undernourished children of the Labrador coast. Miss Marion Moseley, after her graduation from Bryn Mawr College nearly two years ago, took a special course under Dr. Emerson, of Boston, a pioneer worker in the field of undernourished children. Last summer she applied her training in practical fashion on the coast of Labrador, working under the special direction of the Grenfell Mission. While there she took many photographs illustrating the need on that northern coast and these have been made into slides which the congregation saw last Sunday night. Miss Moseley indicated the various phases of the work and mentioned some of the great difficulties such as the ignorance and superstition of the parents. She brought in many humorous touches in the course of the lecture and proved that in the field of public speaking she is as skillful as in the field of dietetics.

Dr. Wilfrid Grenfell is so well known in this country because of his remarkable pioneering work among the fisher folk of the Labrador coast that no one needs to be informed of the worth of the hospitals, schools, co-operative stores, and other philanthropic organizations he has founded among the needy people. After thirty years of such missionary endeavor Dr. Grenfell is no longer able to carry the full burden of raising the funds for his work. An Endowment Fund has been started by the friends who know the need that exists and the worth of the work already attempted to alleviate it. Miss Moseley promised Dr. Grenfell that at each meeting which she addressed in the interests of his work an offering would be taken for this Endowment Fund. As a result of last Sunday night's meeting about \$250.00 has been received. Doubtless there are many who were unable to come to the meeting and who would like to share in the contribution. Miss Moseley or Mr. Charles Harbaugh, benevolence treasurer of the Presbyterian church, will be very glad to receive additional funds.
