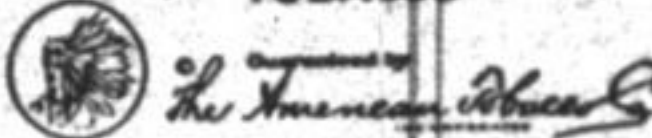

**LAKE COUNTY MAN
IS GIVEN HONOR**

Fred Kirschner Is Elected Vice-President of Milk Producers' Association

Fred Kirschner of Cuba township was elected second vice-president of the Milk Producers' Association at their annual meeting in Chicago. Other officers named were: President, Frank T. Holt, Kenosha. First vice-president, Roy Lewis, of Wheaton. Third vice-president, George Bonshall, Sharon, Wis. Secretary, E. C. Rockwell, St. Charles. Treasurer, A. S. Robinson, Lake Geneva, Wis.

Mrs. M. B. Loomis of Barrington township addressed the meeting in the interest of a woman's auxiliary and the organization of a woman's branch was officially organized and a campaign for new members will be started throughout the dairy district. The association voted to assist the national federation officers in their efforts to get a six cent tax on butter coming into this country from Argentina, Holland and Denmark, and a resolution was adopted offering surplus milk for the starving children of Europe.

A finance committee will be named at a meeting of the board of directors Friday. This committee is at present made up of C. W. Wing, St. Charles; Wm. Kumpf, Barrington township; and W. F. Graham of Aurora. This committee will very likely be reappointed.

At this session it was decided to drop the word "Protective" from the official name of the association. This word has been dropped in general usage for several years.

A meeting of delegates to the marketing company will be held next week. The Borden plant at Algonquin has been closed and the milk is being diverted to the malted milk plant of the company at Elgin and to the St. Charles condensing plant owned by the marketing company. The marketing company has been negotiating for the purchase of the Algonquin plant.

**MRS. BUSSE WINS
IN COURT DECISION**

Appeal of Widow of Former Chicago Mayor is Dismissed by the Supreme Court

The Supreme Court last Friday dismissed the appeal of Mrs. Fred Busse wherein she sought to have the verdict of the Lake County court set aside, a decree which gave the 37 acre Busse farm at Fox Lake to Mrs. Caroline Busse, own mother of Chicago's former mayor.

And by the supreme court ruling it means that the mother gets clear title to the Busse farm, one of the most valuable in western Lake County.

The mayor's widow tried to have the courts give her the place but the mother and her son, George, went into court and showed how the place was bought with money which the father and mother had loaned to their son, Fred, and therefore the claim of the widow was unjust. The higher court's ruling ends the litigation.
