SHERWIN ESTATE IS VALUED AT \$125,000

Will Admitted to Record in Probate Court Last Monday

The will of John Sherwin of Highland Park, president of the Chicago Hardware Foundry company of North Chicago, and one of the leading manufacturers on the North Shore, whose death occurred two weeks ago, was admitted to record Monday in the Probate court, his estate being valued at \$125,000.

All the real and personal property goes to his widow, Mrs. Elizabeth Sherwin, who will have control during her lifetime, after which it will go to their three sons, Edward B., who has succeeded his father as president of the foundry company, Francis J., and Raymond F. Sherwin.

Mrs. Sherwin was named executrix and James F. Hayes, William R. Dalsiel and James W. Ellis were appointed appraisers. The will was drawn up May 9, 1910, and was witnessed by James T. Hayes, John Kristan and Patrick Milroy.
