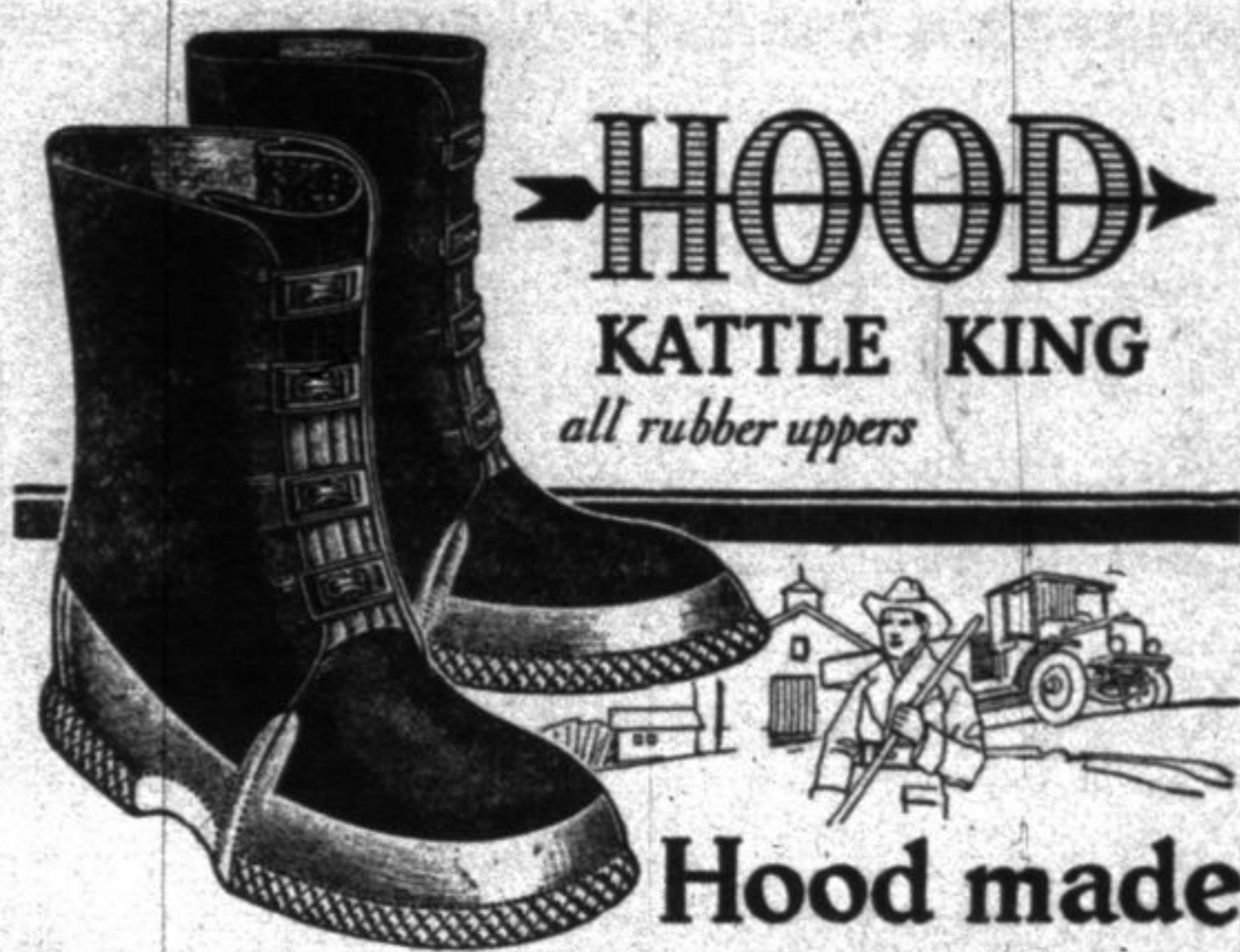

STATE OWES COUNTY LARGE SUM OF MONEY
 Money Due Lake County May be Used for Road Work Purposes

Refund money totalling several million dollars will be sought of the legislature by many Illinois counties, including Lake county, as allotments which, it is averred, the state owes for roads built with county bond issues and accepted by the state as state-aid roads.

Announcement that effect is made by Vermillion county officials who authorized William R. Moore, county clerk there, to send questionnaires to various counties throughout the state seeking refunders for state-aid roads.

Charles Russell, county superintendent of highways of Lake county, has received one of these questionnaires and has filled it out. It is shown that the state owes Lake county a refund of \$500,000. Of this amount \$445,000 is from the state bond and \$55,000 from the state-aid fund.

The state owes Lake county a refund of over \$140,000 on Sheridan road alone, and the rest of the half million dollars will be owed when large paving jobs under way now are completed. This includes the paving of Belvidere road and the Volo road job. When the large sum of money is received from the state it will be used in paying for the paving of other roads in the county.

Exclusive of Lake county Clerk Moore of Vermillion county has received sixteen replies from the questionnaires. One is from Cook county where the officials charge the state owes \$1,678,961.71.

SOLDIERS IN HOSPITALS RECEIVE VALENTINES
 Junior Red Cross Members Distribute Delicacies Among Hospital Patients Feb. 14

"What does the owl say?" "Who? Who? Who?" "Who do we love?" "We love the soldiers, We do! We do! We do!" This was the announcement made on some of the valentines sent by the Junior Red Cross members to the soldiers in the contract hospitals. It was proved not only by the hundreds of hand-made valentines and original rhymes, but by the dozens of glasses of jelly, the graphophone records, the books, the dozens of heart-shaped cookies and just plain cookies and fudge which accompanied the valentines. It is a part of the program of the Junior Red Cross to break the monotony for the sick soldiers, by remembering them one holiday each month, and the soldiers like it—they "knew I was coming and they were lined up at the door of the hospital asking if they could help carry the jelly," said one distributor of the valentines.
