1920 TAX INCREASE INVALID—BRUNDAGE

The current year should have extended same on the assessment made by the local assessor in 1919, or on the increased assessment made by the board of review.

In reply I will say that in addition to the opinion in the case of People ex rel v. Vail, the court at the same term rendered a similar opinion in the case of People ex rel v. Abraham et al, which in effect holds invalid, for the same reason, the action of the board of review in increasing the assessment of lands and lots in the city of Waukegan.

If, as held by the court in the above cited cases, the increased assessment made by the board of review in 1919 was not a valid assessment upon which to extend tax levies in 1920, it necessarily follows that said assessment would not be a valid one on which to extend tax levies in 1920. Upon the facts as set forth by you, the county clerk is extending tax levies in 1920 should have made such extension upon the assessment of 1919 as made by the local assessor, and not on the increased assessment made by the board of review, which the court in People ex rel v. Vail and People ex rel v. Abraham, supra, holds invalid.

Noting the provisions of paragraph 117 of the Revenue act, which requires taxes other than State taxes to be extended upon the valuation as equalized by the board of review, I will say that said sanction contemplates a valid action by the board of review in the matter of fixing such equalization. The Board of review in fixing such equalization must act in accordance with the provisions of said paragraph 329 of the Revenue act.

In this connection I will call your attention to the decision of the Supreme Court in the following cases, People v. Shirk, 252 Ill. 95, Chicago and Northwestern Ry. Co. v. People, 193, Ill. 594, and People ex rel v. St. Louis Merchants Bridge Co. 268 Ill. 477.

BOARD HAS NOT YET VALIDATED ACTION

tax this year is spread on the same assessed valuation including the illegal and void 20%. The same objections to the taxes will be this year as last, but by reason of the fact that the tax rate is greater this year, the percentage of illegal taxes assessed against each individual taxpayer is larger than 18%. Those that believe that 18% of their tax is the only illegal tax against them are acting under a mistaken state of facts. Upon a superficial investigation it appears the illegal tax will amount to 30% if not more.

The illegal 30% added \$900,000 to the valuations in Highland Park, and the tax on this at a rate of \$8.23 per \$100 valuation makes an illegal tax of approximately \$75,000.

The tax payers objected to the payment of an illegal tax in the past year have been subject to some criticism, but it has been through a mistake idea and misunderstanding of the duty of the taxpayer and the taxing body. It is, it seems to me, as much the duty of the tax payer that he should pay his just share of taxes as it is that the assessing body should levy only legal taxes upon him. The protection of our institutions lies in proceeding in a proper legal manner. These questions can be adjudicated by proper action in court, where taxing authorities have departed from the lawful manner of levying taxes.

There is no reason why the citizens of a taxing district should not have the benefit of a valid levy pursuant to equalized valuations. If taxing bodies acting for them have erred or departed from the rules required by law, it is their right to object. Instead of criticism to the objectors, who have objected to an illegal tax, they should be commended as they have conferred a benefit upon the community. The objections to the 30% horizontal raise has been characterized as technical, but in fact they are fundamental. The County Court so held and the Supreme Court affirmed the action of the lower court in this language:

The action of the Board of Review was equivalent to a final determination of the question in advance of the hearing. . . . That was not a compliance with the purpose and spirit of the statute requiring notice and an opportunity to the property owners to be heard. They were entitled to a hearing before the question was decided, but they were not given that privilege.

If the tax payer voluntarily pays an unjust and illegal tax it cannot be recovered.

If an illegal tax is extended against the property of the tax payer, he may pay the just part of the taxes, if it can be ascertained, and object to the illegal part of his taxes upon the application for judgment and sale in the County Court as was done by objectors last year. This is the best remedy available after a tax has once been extended.
