#### JUDICIAL CONVENTION HELD LAST SATURDAY

DELEGATES AT ROCKFORD

Judges C. C. Edwards, R. K. Welsh and E. D. Shurtleff Given Unanimous Vote in This District

The three sitting judges, Judges C. C. Edwards of Lake county, R. K. Welsh of Winnebago county, and E. D. Schurtleff of McHenry county were unanimously re-nominated by the Republican delegates from this the 17th Judicial District, at a convention held in the court house Rockford Saturday afternoon.

The convention was called to order by Arthur E. Johnson of Rockford, chairman of the Winnebago county delegation. Upon motion James M. Huff of Belvidere was nominated for chairman and William J. However, the drive was not without exciting incidents for the autoists got into the very severe blizzard of Saturday night and those drivers, some of whom had been driving for many years, declare they never went through such a blizgard in their lives. The north shore here had a small blizzard but it wasn't comparable to the weather in the northwestern part of the district.

The roads were something fierce and the snow and wind came down so that the drivers were blinded. It certainly was a wild, exciting ride which the judicial deelgates had by way of Lake Geneva and then later home. The storm was so bad that some of them remained in Lake Geneva all Saturday night and those who did take the drive home got lost en route and had an "awful time."
