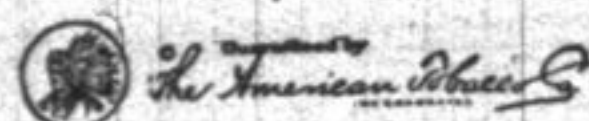

BIG NAVAL REVIEW A FEATURE OF PAGEANT

PLANS NOW COMPLETED

Submarine Chasers, Gunboats,
and Hydro-Airplanes Secured
For Pageant of Progress
This Summer

The greatest naval pageant ever staged in fresh water will be one of the big features of the Pageant of Progress, to be held on Chicago's \$5,000,000 Municipal Pier July 30 to August 14. Plans for this wonderful water spectacle have been completed by Capt. Edward A. Evers, commander of the Illinois branch of the United States Naval Reserves. Maneuvers of every description known to naval science, sham battles, gunboats bombarded from the air by bombs from hydro-aeroplanes, search light and signal drills at night, when the ships will be illuminated, cutter races, pulling races, swimming contests between the Jackies of the Great Lakes Naval Training station, and the boys of the Naval Reserves in Lake Michigan off the Municipal Pier, a big band parade of more than 10,000 members of the Naval Reserves from all the nearby states on "Naval Reserve Day" tentatively set for August 6, were among the features announced this week by Capt. Evers to Mayor Thompson.

Six gunboats, two hydro-aeroplanes and three submarine chasers have been secured already by Capt. Evers from the Navy Department. The gunboats are: the U. S. S. Wilmette, with the Illinois Naval Reserves, U. S. S. Essex, from Minnesota; U. S. S. Gopher, from Ohio; U. S. S. Yantic, from Michigan, and the U. S. S. Hawk, from Wisconsin. There will be at least two hundred men on each gunboat. Three sub-chasers, with thirty men each, will form part of the fleet, which will rendezvous off the Municipal Pier during the entire period of the exposition.

Six hundred jackies and a band from the Great Lakes Naval Training station, under command of Capt. W. D. Wurtsbaugh, will establish a model naval camp just west of the pier. The sailors will give exhibition drills every afternoon and participate in a parade daily through the Loop. The Jackie band will play for the lowering of colors at night, and will give evening concerts.

Visitors to the exposition will have an opportunity to witness the American Navy in action. The boats will be put through all the tactical movements of modern warfare, and the airship bombers will endeavor to demonstrate that the gunboat has no chance against the fighters of the air. The crews of the gunboats coming to Chicago have started practice for the maneuvers, Capt. Evers, with the Wilmette, was the first to begin the cruising this week to get his men in trim for the Pageant program.

"The gunboats and sub-chasers will come in and anchor as a fleet," said Capt. Evers. "There will be daily maneuvers, and a keen rivalry already has been worked up among the boys on the gunboats of the various states to excel in the handling of the ships in the battle and fleet formations during the sham battles. One of the most interesting phases of this part of the naval demonstration will be the bombardment of the gunboats by the hydro-aeroplanes.

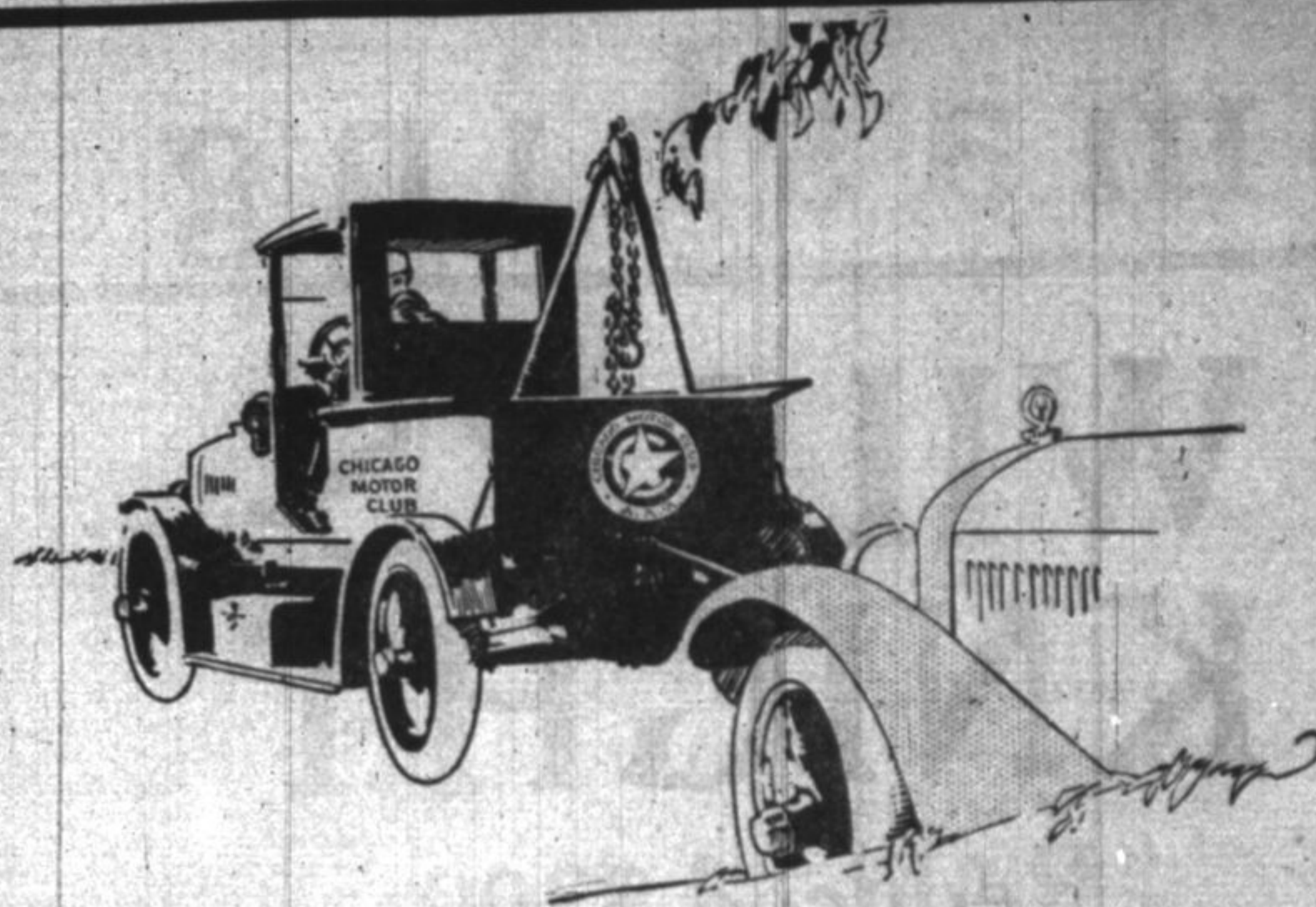
"The naval spectacle will be something that Chicago and the visitors to the exposition will never forget. During the evenings all the boats will be illuminated, and the little launches plying back and forth from one boat to another, with the water ablaze with light will present a picturesque scene. At night there will be searchlight and flag drills. Every phase of naval science will be displayed.

"We will have a big 'Naval Reserve Day,' tentatively set for August 6, when more than 10,000 members of the Naval Reserves from Michigan, Illinois, Indiana, Wisconsin, Minnesota and Ohio will be landed and participate in a parade through the Loop. In the evening of Naval Reserve Day there will be a big dance on the Municipal Pier.

"In addition to the maneuvers, sham battles and night naval features that will be the greatest ever witnessed in fresh water, we will have cutter races, pulling races and swimming contests off the pier in which both the Naval Reserves and the Jackies from the Great Lakes Naval Training Station will take part. On Sundays we will bring the gunboats and sub-chasers up along side the Municipal Pier when the visitors to the exposition will be permitted to go aboard and inspect the war craft. During the speed boat races, which are being arranged for the Pageant, in which some of the fastest motor boats in the country will take part, the warships and sub-chasers will act as patrols."

Besides the spectacular part of the navy's participation in the Pageant of Progress, there will be educational features exhibited on the pier itself. These will include a Radio school, in which the wireless will be shown in operation; an aviation school, where the mechanics of this branch of the navy may be seen, a hospital corps and a recruiting station. Capt. Evers has asked for 6000 square feet of space for the educational exhibits.
